The internal painting of the clubhouse has been completed; the memorabilia, trophies, photos and Presidents' Honour Board are on display; the floorboards sanded & polished; and the comfy lounges all look terrific; capped off recently with a 65cm TV donated to the club and installed above the fireplace. This is now such an inviting place to participate in social activities or to view the 2020 Australian Open if you are down at the courts.

As a result of the winter winds, you might have noticed in recent months a significant lean to the external fence facing Campbell St. This has now been fully stabilised.

We also mentioned in the last newsletter that the Club was lucky enough to receive a grant for **Disability Access** to Campbell Street. The project has been completed with ramp access from the front gate and the old external toilet demolished and replaced by a wheelchair/disability access toilet and a portable ramp onto the courts. The club had a fantastic **official opening** on Saturday 3 August, officiated by Club President Kathy Sly and official guests Hon John Barilaro, Deputy Premier of NSW and Member for Monaro; Councillor Mark Schweikert, Deputy Mayor Queanbeyan Palerang Regional Council; and Mr Kim Kachel CEO Tennis ACT. After hearing from all three guests, the Deputy Premier and very special guest William McLennan ended formalities by untying the ribbon to declare the works complete.
