Red Hill Roos may well change their name to the Red Hill Cats after the **Div 7 Monday** night Tennis League Team used up at least 9 lives in their heart-stopping Grand Final victory over Kaleen at the ROOS RANGE on Wednesday night (June 2022).

When the teams were split at 1 apiece after a tight 4-6 doubles loss for Adrian McConnon and Chris Chapman and a composed, clinical 6-1 singles victory from team no.1 Saurabh Anand there was little sign of the madness to come. This is about the time the full moon shot out above Carey Gardens Village and things got crazy!

Only the most die-hard ROOS fans still gave Chris 'Chappo' Chapman a hope when he fell behind 1-4, in the no.2 singles rubber. Pizzey Cup

Club member Sophie McDonald was selected to play in Pizzey Cup this year. The club donated \$100 to contribute towards Sophie's participating costs. Here is a thank you and lovely article from Sophie:

It was a real privilege to represent the 2023 ACT Secondary Schools Pizzey Cup team and THANK YOU very much for the \$100 contribution from Red Hill Tennis Club - very generous. It went towards off-setting the ACT uniform costs and once again, I'm pretty sure I was the only team member to receive assistance from their tennis club - thank you very much!

The Pizzey Cup has been going since 1963. It is Australia's premier secondary schools tennis event where the leading 16 (8 boys, 8 girls), year 7 to year 12 players from every state and territory (with the exception of Northern Territory this year) square off against each other, to determine the champion state and champion individual male and female.

This year's championships were held in Canberra. I was one of three Narrabundah College girls selected and the girls manager was one of my favourite teachers from Telopea School, so I was looking forward to being involved with her again!

Though I didn't contribute much on **Day 1** the ACT Girls served a little notice when we actually beat Qld - though when combined with the boys team we lost narrowly overall. **Day 2** was a beauty. After a heavy loss in the individual singles tournament on Day 1, I had one of my best singles wins in the consolation event, over a Queenslander. Despite the girls narrowly going down to WA, I was reunited with one of my regular doubles partners Aliyah Dwyer and we had a decisive win. The Managers then left us together and we went on a bit of an undefeated run, getting up over SA, VIC, and NSW (who were crowned 2023 Pizzey Cup champions).

The Girls Team were lucky enough to record more victories against SA and VIC. The Girls' defeats of QLD and VIC were '1sts' for the Territory. The boys team were great and had some top results but as a team we still hadn't won overall, then came the Tasmania matchACT prevailed 17 rubbers to 1. I was fortunate enough to contribute a singles and mixed doubles victory. It was a great end to a special week and the team managers were very happy.
