We have some club events coming up with the AGM next week (this really is a non-threatening occasion which coincides with Thursday social tennis), a couple of working bees to get the maintenance under control and a social night after Easter because it's been too long since we had a roaring blaze in the fire pit and a bbq! And we're saying farewell to the McLeishs as they have moved to their farm near Delegate. There are more details on all this below together with reports on membership, coaching news and our pennant teams.	
Membership	Thanks so much for supporting the club again this year. We have around 140 members so far — a large group of tennis lovers from across the ACT - such a great thing. We have to thank our indefatigable Membership Secretary in the Geneva branch of the Red Hill Tennis Club — Libby McCutchan. Libby works behind the scenes and on the other side of the world, in a different time zone to do all the work to process our memberships. Pennant News	Our junior pennant teams have started up again with our biggest number of teams ever — 19 teams ranging from two teams in Division 1 to the whole of Division 7 being Red Hill teams!!!! We are still the best represented club in Junior pennant thanks to the amazing enthusiasm of Matt and the support of David Lloyd and Carolyn Paris. Keep an eye on how they are progressing with Matt's chart on the Pennant notice board at the clubhouse. We also have 3 Adult pennant teams competing on Monday nights competing in Division 2 and 3.	
New lights	We are so excited to tell you that the ACT Government has been working with the committee to see if they can help fund new lighting for the courts.	

The initial process involves three tenders for:

- the supply of the lighting arrays;
- the installation of electrical cabling (including digging trenches) and the light poles & bases, and the light control system.
- the rolling up of the synthetic grass before the trenches get dug then the remediating of the grass and the clay courts after the work is completed.

If all the tenders go well, the ACT Government will provide us with a grant to obtain new lights.

We would really love to get LED lighting as it expected to provide consistent, maintenance free lighting for at least 30 years! But I'm sure you'll agree any improvement to our old, dangerous lights will be very welcome. In the meantime lets all keep our fingers crossed (and try not to hit the lights with tennis balls) that the old lights hold out until new lighting can be put in!.

As part of this process the ACT Government has funded lighting engineers to provide technical assistance for assessing the tenders and the project management, including making sure there isn't light spilling out to the surrounding properties and making sure all Australian lighting and building standards are met.

Clay Court upgrade – Granite Pride

We have put off the upgrade of the clay courts until new lighting has been sorted out as it will involve trenching in the clay courts.

In the meantime, our president, Marc Mowbray-d'Arbela has worked tirelessly to keep rainwater channelling away from the baselines to reduce water-logging as well as spraying weeds and removing leaves and berries from the Carnegie side of the courts.

Thanks to everyone who looks after the clay courts, watering them before playing and bagging them after your games. I hope you were rewarded with the smell of lovely wet loam, a firm surface to play on and a sense of satisfaction as you dragged the carpet over the court at the end of your game.

There have even been mystery clay court carers sweeping the lines before Junior Pennant on Sunday mornings. And thanks must also go to Matt McDonald's crew who roll the courts as they need it.

As with the lights, we'll keep you informed about the dates of the clay court upgrade which might mean they are out of action for a short time, but you will be astounded how good they will be to play on afterwards! We'll be able to feel even more Granite Pride!

Tree clean-up on Carnegie Street side	We have been talking to the ACT Government to see if they can tame the trees overhanging the Carnegie Crescent end of the courts. After several visits to the courts by the government officers, we have received an overwhelming response saying they will not only do a trim but they will provide a 2 metre clearing from the court boundary and they will remove the weedy undergrowth and dumped green waste. This will help with the drainage of the courts (which naturally slope that way) and reduce shading of the courts and reduce leaves and berries dropping onto the courts. It will also provide greater amenity while maintaining the green backdrop to the courts that we all appreciate. The ACT officers could not give a date for this work to be done, but it should be within the next 6 months. We are very grateful to this assistance provided by the ACT Government and we will write to them once the work is completed to say thanks.
McLeish Farewell	As part of the Great Big Working Bee (see below) we will be holding a bbq to formally say farewell to Toni and Robert McLeish. We think this is fitting as Robert and Toni organised many working bees in their time providing amazing stewardship of the club resources.
