COURT CARE & BOOKINGS

With Night Comp in full swing, and Pennant underway, tennis is very popular, and court availability is quite limited, especially from 5.00pm weekdays, and generally on the weekend.

You MUST book a court if you wish to play, & play on the court that you booked!

You MUST also pay a Visitor's Fee before playing if you invite a friend to have a hit.

Watering from fence to fence before you play is very important (if no rain!) – and you should water again at least every 30 minutes. We also request that the court surface is sprinkled before bagging the court – that helps stop the en tous cas from blowing away.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023

Participation this year was similar to 2022, with 67 entries from 57 players contesting in just 8 of a possible 25 or more events. Most popular event was the Open Men's Singles, with 24 entries, and a Qualifying round was staged to manage the draw. No Ladies' events were played, and again there were insufficient entries for any Committee level categories. A welcome difference was the return of Juniors' events, with Open Singles for both Boys and Girls being included in the active program.

SKYRAIL - Help needed!!

This State Government project includes removal of 8 rail level crossings between Park St Parkville and Albion St Brunswick, to be replaced by Skyrail on the Upfield line, which runs past our Club next to the bike path and courts 14, 8 and 4.
