REPORT ON RIVERLAND TENNIS VETERAN 3 DAY EVENT

Hi all,

As you are all aware the 36th Riverland Veteran teams event was conducted last Saturday, Sunday and Monday.

The Riverland Veterans Association would like to thank all clubs for the courts and catering that was conducted prior to and during the event. An exceptionally high positive response was forthcoming regarding the court surfaces, facilities and catering **at all venues**.

Several members of the veteran association spoke with many of the captains, players and spectators to get some feedback on how the event, and in particular the changes initiated this year, were received. (We have also put a feedback form out to captains and players to allow for both positive and negative comments to be submitted).

Our *initial feedback* has indicated very strong support for the single venue per day and the catering at all venues. The early start (8.30) was not quite as strongly supported however still appears to be around 90%.

The pizza night was well supported but we did receive quite a few comments regarding a "social" night, perhaps on the Sunday evening, to give more time to get together with other players. We will pursue this over the next couple of months to see if it is a feasible option.

We are now looking to the clubs to give us your feedback on the event.

- In particular was the catering adequately supported in most areas?
- Was the egg and bacon in the mornings a viable initiative?
- Given a "first up" at catering were there any major problems encountered that we need to address? (I appreciate that clubs may have identified local issues that they can handle at club level)!
- Was the requirement to "bag" the courts handled without too much difficulty it was GREATLY appreciated by the players.
- We were made aware of a few minor issues at clubs and we will advise the clubs of these shortly.
- Is there anything we, as an association, can reasonably do to assist you with this event in the future?
