With just the four players, they all had to play every match. Well done!!!

Congratulations to all those players. We provide a small (\$350) subsidy to these players for their travel costs, plus Tennis SA gives them \$150. In future for the teams to be selected for 2012, we have decided to increase our subsidy to \$500. However, to be eligible for it, players must play in our State Championships and in our teams at the Australian Championships.

Our accommodation at Jesmond was very convenient, economical and adequate; thanks to Sue. Our State Dinner, which we thought had been organized, but hadn't, had to have some fast footwork for a venue. ITF have brought in an I-PIN, which players must purchase for \$30 annually (\$20 initially) to be able to enter an ITF tournament (our State Championships, Mildura, Australian Individuals etc). Entry then is only by using this I-PIN via the internet. We do not like it as it almost certainly will be detrimental to our State Championship numbers. However, we appear to be stuck with it.

At our centre, we are now hiring the courts on Saturday mornings to Pulteney as their teams have increased. The two courts we have to leave open to the public are also being very well used.

Our competitions are all going very well and Tuesday Social Tennis is increasing every week with usually ten courts in use. We are getting a new member nearly every week.

A new annual National Ranking Seniors Tournament is being arranged in conjunction with Tennis SA in the Barossa on 19th to 21st August, which is during the Gourmet Weekend. It will be held in Lyndoch and it is proposed that it will start Friday afternoon, then continue Saturday morning and Sunday, leaving Saturday afternoon for an arranged coach tour of wineries.

In the meantime we have just had the City v Country annual match, which City won by two sets. A full report elsewhere.

A luncheon has been arranged by Sue Hand and her social committee for 27th February featuring the Bush Poet Bob Magor and catered for by the Royal Tandoori Indian Restaurant. This should be over by the time you read this and I am sure will have been a great success.

- 7. Maintain high personal behaviour standards at all times.
- 8. Abide by the rules and respect the decision of the umpire, match referee or other adjudicator, making all appeals through the formal process and respecting the final decision.
- 9. Be honest in your attitude and preparation to training. Work equally hard for yourself and your team/crew.
- 10. Cooperate with coaches and staff in development of programs to adequately prepare you for competition at the highest level.


The opening ceremony was very good and well done, the State and Presentation dinners were good as usual as was the social scene in between.






