President's Report

Berri Teams 25th Carnival – We have, again just finished this great weekend which had 97 teams with over 500 players from Vic, NSW, ACT, Qld, WA and NZ, supplementing our many from country SA and, of course, the multitude from Adelaide – members and nearly as many non-members - enjoying this weekend and playing some great tennis in the middle of it. If you missed it, put it in your diary for next year as you will have a ball. Our thanks go to the Riverland



Seniors especially Kaye and Peter Tanner for running such a superb carnival of tennis. **Our Australian President, Reg Trevaskis** was looking to come to SA for the first time ever and see our set up at South Parklands so I suggested he came when Berri was on, so he came and played in a team with me and was absolutely amazed at the facilities for tennis at the four centres we use. He thinks we could hold an Australian or a World Championships there at some time in the future. See Reg's report and some photos on the Tennis Seniors Australia website. You can access it directly or through a link on our newly designed Tennis Seniors SA website that I am sure you all have bookmarked on your favourites on your computer.

Website - Our website is worth a look now as it has been revamped and modernized by Sue McKelvie, Brian Dew and Rob Crawford with help from Clare Chapman (Tennis SA) and Ian Somers who does the Tennis Seniors Australia website. Sue would greatly appreciate input from any of you for this. Tell us what you think we do right or even if it is possible improve, on at Berri for instance.

City v Northern Areas –Again this year in March we held this annual match for the **Brian Pink Memorial Trophy** with Northern Areas having their second win in the last three years. As usual, it was well run and catered for by Twink Sparks and his team at Jamestown with all players enjoying the day. Congratulations to Northern Areas.

Winter Competitions and Adelaide Hockey Club - Last year at this time, I reported on the problems we were having with AHC and their perception of our right to use the clubhouse during winter. I am pleased to advise that they have acknowledged the problems that were occurring and, having changed their

Committee, have appointed a new consortium representative – Philip Rundle, (a former President), who has acknowledged that they would not now be in existence if it was not for our large financial assistance during the prolonged court case. Relationships have greatly improved which of course they had to where different bodies are sharing such a marvellous facility as we have.

Our winter competition is progressing, but with a few hiccups. Monday nights we have 7 teams playing in the Mixed competition which utilizes 6 courts, but the Division 1 men at this stage have not been able to get enough participants to start their competition, so have been playing impromptu sets with the few who have turned up. They hope to get a competition started soon.

The Wednesday night has 6 women's teams and 19 men's Division 2 teams, which means doubling up on some of the courts. There have unfortunately been several forfeits in the men's events, which are detrimental and I will be recommending to the committee that these teams are putting themselves in jeopardy for next season.

New Thursday Morning Competition – this has started, essentially for men, as there has been no daytime midweek men's competition ever that I am aware of. It is an open event and we have one new lady member, Linda Lam, playing in it. There are two Divisions consisting of four teams, each of 3 players per team. Division 1 players play a double with each of the others in their team and, while the 2's and 3's are playing, the No. 1's play a single. Division 2 teams do not play the single. It is being played over a 7 weeks season with several players new to Seniors and some former members returning. There will be a break and then recommence on 12th July with possibly an extra two teams in the Division 1 competition. Anyone interested in playing or filling in, please let me know.

Pindarie Wines Seniors Tournament – Lyndoch – Barossa Valley 15th – 16th Sept 2012 - A National Ranking 6 Tournament. We held this last year for the first time and those that played enjoyed the event with the associated social functions. We found however that it clashed with the finals of Adelaide week-end winter competitions, so the dates have been changed to September. We have less Seniors tournaments in SA than in any other state, so I encourage you to ensure this one is supported. See our website for further details.

Australian Teams Carnival– Perth January 2013 – Yes, they are to be held again in Perth as ACT is unable to have the required number of courts available due to a \$20m upgrade. The WA people always do it well, so please complete the entry form enclosed with this SAVET to help us make up as many teams as possible. There should be a Division 2 in most age brackets, so everyone can play in this carnival. The ten year bracket format tried last year was successful and will be utilized again. At this stage, the next carnival in SA will be in 2017.

40 Years Anniversary Dinner Dance is to be held on 17th November 2012 at West Adelaide Football Clubrooms. Sue Hand and her committee are organizing this terrific night. See pages 28, 29 and 31 for more details. Keep the date free.

Tennis SA has a new CEO, Steve Baldas, whom I met at recent meetings. We wish him well in his new position. He is just old enough to qualify as a Senior.

Car Park – Adelaide City Council have confirmed that resurfacing and line-marking for parking has been approved. It will be done in the near future.

We currently have **tennis this winter** Monday nights, Tuesday mornings, Wednesday nights and Thursday mornings (I play most of them) so there are plenty of opportunities for your tennis. I hope you are enjoying it.

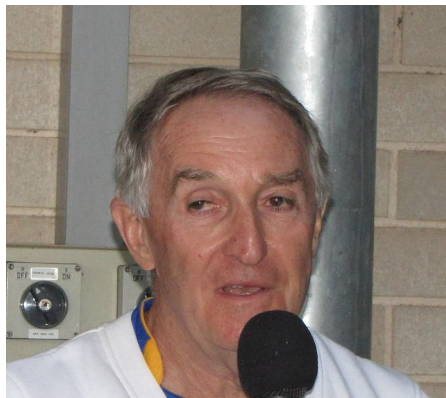

Once again the Entertainment Books have been distributed and my thanks go to Carol Delbridge for once again selling sixteen!

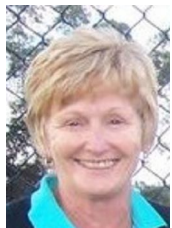

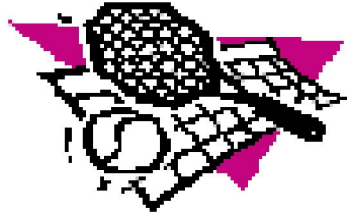

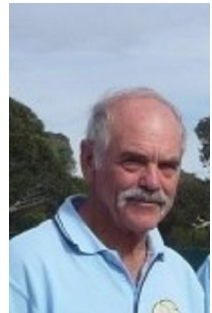
