Retiring President's Report to AGM

I have pleasure in delivering this, my fifth and last President's Report to the 2013 AGM.

Competitions:

Our summer competitions in general are going very well. Thursday night's men's B grade has outgrown the number of courts, which has meant that most matches had to share courts, with the ensuing late finishes. This coming summer, the B3 competition is to be scheduled on Tuesday nights, sharing the night with the ladies' B grade competition, which should ease the situation on Thursdays. The winter competitions now have the Division 1 men's matches going again on the Monday nights, sharing with the mixed competition. Wednesday night ladies and with men's B grade restricting the number of teams,



there is now no court sharing and the resultant freezing between sets.

Mid-week daytime competitions, started last winter, have proven very popular with four teams each in two divisions, with the Division 1 matches including some singles. These are open competitions with mainly men playing, but we do have a few women enjoying it too.

Social Tennis:

This is still thriving on Tuesday mornings with 10+ courts usually in use.

Membership:

Our membership has increased another 18 this year to 586. A new Regional Division has recently been established, Fleurieu Tennis Seniors, based at Port Elliot. We are working closely with people from the Barossa and Gawler to establish new Regions there. These of course complement our existing Regions of Northern Areas, South-East, Murray Bridge and Riverland. I am hoping that these initiatives will enable us to grow our membership throughout the whole state, which as an Association, is our responsibility. I take this opportunity to thank those running those Divisions for the great work they do.

2013 Australian Tennis Seniors Teams Carnival:

Our team numbers were down a bit this year, mainly due to the need to hold it in Perth for the second time in a row. Our only successful team was our men's 35 -49 who defended their 2012 title. Well done all seven of them. Those of us that went still had our usual fun week or two.

2014 Carnival:

This is to be held in Hobart in January from 12th to 17th with the Individuals the following week. Every indication is that this will be well attended with quite an increase in teams from this year. I have been organizing accommodation (some still available) and with that as an indicator our numbers are looking good. If you are thinking of going, please fill out a nomination form and if you want accommodation that is reasonably priced, let me know (or in my absence in September, Janet).

We have a lot of fun for that week and then many of us tour around for the following week. Join us.

Australian Teams:

SA players that made Australian teams this year are Adam Alessandrini, Martin Richards, Gary Nadebaum (he is based in USA), Roger Davey and Bruce Rehn. Congratulations to all of them.

Where are the women?

Tri-State:

SA again won both cups in what has been a great competition. However NSW is struggling to get enough players to commit now that the Mildura Tournament has been downgraded from an ITF event (due to costs involved in meeting ITF criteria – white badge referee at about \$2,500 plus expenses, travel and accommodation). The top players now don't get ITF points and so are not supporting this event. We are currently exploring the possibility of just playing Victoria until a further review of this situation eventuates.

West Beach and Districts Community Bank State Championships:

119 players took part in these Championships with 16 interstate players and one each from Japan and UK. Elaine Caldana as Tournament Director and Geof Palmer as referee ensured that it all went smoothly.

Our thanks again go to our naming sponsor West Beach and Districts Community Bank and to Kevin Furst, Serve Furst the Club Shop, for their support of this event.

City v Country:

This again was not played and we are still looking at ways of reviving or replacing it.

City v Northern Areas:

This was played at our headquarters this year with good support from both Northern Areas and City enabling full teams of twerlve men and twelve women to enjoy one of the best days tennis we have. Our thanks go to all those who participated and assisted with getting the teams together, running the day and providing that great nourishment. City regained the Brian Pink Memorial Shield.

Berri Teams Carnival:

We had 94 teams with again over 500 players from all mainland states and NZ enjoying this marvelous event. The weather was great and we all enjoyed ourselves, on the courts and off. Thanks again to Kaye and Peter Tanner and their committee for all their work.

This has been the envy of most states and WA and NSW have now copied this, in a small way, at Bunbury and Newcastle respectively.

Barossa Seniors Tournament - Lyndoch:

This was again held in 2012 during September, but only attracted about thirty participants -t those of us that did play enjoyed it. Tournament Director Sharon Jenner is changing it to a teams' format for this year.

Our 40th Anniversary Dinner:

What a great night that was. It was held at the West Adelaide Football Clubrooms in November, organized by Sue Hand and her tremendous band of helpers and also produced the great History Booklet – this was under Malcolm Beddome's direction. Thanks to all those involved.

Courts and Clubhouse:

We now have the forecourt area fenced off. This was finished at the end of last summer, so this summer we should get the benefit of being able to leave tables and chairs outside under the shade cloths. Carpark resurfacing and line marking was also completed. A new machine for vacuuming the courts (both sand and leaves etc) was purchased and is enabling Louis to keep our facilities up to scratch. He puts in a lot of time on the courts, not all of which is paid for.

Thanks Louis.

We are in the process of negotiating, in association with Hockey, to put Solar Panels on the roof of the clubhouse and also the pavilion to drastically cut power bills (currently \$27,000 p.a. between us and Hockey).

Seniors Tennis in the Regional Areas:

The small committees of these do a wonderful job ensuring that Tennis Seniors is spread throughout the state. We hold a meeting in July each year with the executives of these Regions when we are able to keep them informed of what is going on throughout Australia and also to allow them to compare the varying ways in which they conduct Seniors Tennis in their Regions. I have worked with Scott Nottle from Port Elliot to recently establish the new Fleurieu Region and I invited Sharon Jenner to our meeting as she is looking to establish a Barossa Region. I am also in contact with Rick Bailey, tournament director of Gawler Tennis Club, re setting up a Region there.

Turned and turning 90:

This refers to two of our wonderful members – Malcolm Howard and Henry Young. Malcolm turned 90 in April and Henry turns 90 next month. Malcolm had some heart problems two or three years ago and sensibly decided to only play socially now. Henry still plays everything, including the ball machine, many times a week.

Don't we all hope that we are still playing at 90. Best of health to them both.

Fees:

Australia wide (except WA), the states have agreed to reduce their annual subscriptions to their State Association to \$20. We propose at this meeting to do so. However, there will be a separate fee of \$40 to belong to South Park Seniors Tennis Centre; in effect leaving the fee for city members in total as \$60. Those that do not play here at our headquarters will only have to pay the \$20 to the Association. This has been done in line with the Tennis Seniors Australia policy of pay for play, whereby after this year we will not have to pay them the \$13.20 per member affiliation fee. This will be compensated by a fee of \$2 per person per event at ITF and National Ranking tournaments - our State Championships in this state.

My five years as President:

By the constitution we must get a new President after five years. I have enjoyed this time even though it has been an enormous amount of work, starting with the 2009 Australian Championships. I would like to thank the committee – Janet, Lorna, Dennis and the other committee members who have assisted me to make what I hope has been a continuing improvement to our facilities and your playing enjoyment. I also thank all co-ordinators who do such a lot so that most of you can just turn up and play.

Nominations are still being received as I write this for the incoming President and committee and I wish them well. I remain on the committee as Immediate Past President for the next twelve months.

2014 ITF World Championshps

The 2014 Seniors World Championships will be held at Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, from 21^{st} - 26^{th} April 2014. Closing date for nominations for Australian Teams will be 11^{th} October 2013

The Super-Seniors World Championships will be on the clay courts in Atalya, Turkey from 13th -19th October 2014 for the team competition and 20th -26th October for the individual event. Nominations for Australian team will close on 14 March, 2014

Hobart 2014

The 2014 Australian Teams Carnival will be held in Hobart 12th to 17th January followed by the Individual Australian Seniors Championships from 19th to 24th January.

Mark Handley from Tennis Tasmania updated the Tennis Australian Presidents and Secretaries Meeting in June. It has been twelve years since the event was held in Hobart; all clubs are excited to welcome all the players. They want to present the best event in Seniors' history and also showcase Tasmanian Tennis.

The Australian Carnival is a week of competitive yet social tennis. There are fifty four courts available (all synthetic grass) at nine Tennis Clubs – all within a 10km radius. There are also courts at Cygnet and Sorrell as backup, depending on the number of teams entered. However, these courts are 30-35 minutes away.

The Domain Tennis Centre is the headquarters for the Carnival and is available for the Opening Ceremony. Transport to other courts will be provided if required. Practice courts will be available on the Sunday prior to the teams' event, with each State being allocated a Club.

The Australian Seniors Championships will follow the Team Carnival from 19th to 24th January 2014. This event is an ITF 1 category tournament. For entry procedures, follow the guidelines on the TSA website www.tennisseniors.org.au.

Weekly Competitions

WINTER COMPETITIONS

This winter has seen a number of rain-affected nights, with matches able to be played on 14 of the scheduled 17 Monday nights while Wednesday night men played on 14 nights, with the ladies only playing on 13 nights. Fortunately, our system of determining premiership rankings on basis of points earned divided by number of matches played makes allowance for those teams who play different numbers of matches.

Monday Night

In the Mixed Doubles competition, *BIIKS* have had a very successful season, losing only one match and drawing another. *What a Racquet* can replace *Enigma* at second place on the final night.

The most consistent players have been Bruce Swanson and Joan Sedsman, both from *BIIKS*.

In the Men's A Grade, *Dewce* and *Aceholes* will play in the final, with *Dewce* having led the rankings for most of the season.

Most consistent player has been Nick Scott from Dewce.

Wednesday Night

The Women have again played their different style of competition, with the *Green* team winning the most games for the season (339), followed by *Yellow* who won 313 games. The most consistent player was Jan Davies, from the *Green* tea.

The men's B1 final for the Kevin Sandercock Trophy was won by *Grand Slammers* 10 points to 7 in a deciding match tie-breaker, after they and *Smart Aces* each won 3 sets and 30 games. The most consistent player was John Proctor from *Smart Aces*.

The men's B2 final saw an upset with **No NRG1** defeating the minor premiers **Byron's Battlers**, 3 sets 29 games to 3 sets 24 games. Doug Sowden from **Byron's Battlers** won the trophy for the most consistent player

The <u>Winter day Open competitions</u>, played on Thursday mornings, saw *Hotshots* 3 sets 31 games defeat *United* 2 sets 25 games in the Division 1 final for their first half-season. *Three Musketeers* 5 sets 38 games defeated *The Wasps* 1 set 27 games in the first Division 2 final.

Weather unfortunately prevented finals being played for the second half-season, with *Champs* the leading team in Division 1 and again *Three Musketeers* clearly top of Division 2.

SUMMER COMPETITIONS

Last summer, twenty three teams nominated for Thursday Night Men's B Grade. Sixteen teams had to share courts every week and finishing late, while, in contrast, there were ten empty courts every Tuesday. To prevent a recurrence of that situation this summer, no more than eighteen teams will be scheduled to play on any night and the Men's B3 Division is to play on TUESDAY nights and fill up some of those empty courts.

Vale – Ray Newberry



Ray passed away peacefully on Monday 3rd June of this year, aged 68 years. He was the adored and cherished husband to Donna, much loved and loving father to Katrina and Ben, and loved father-in-law to Ben and Sally. A much loved and adoring Poppa to Lachlan, Mackenzie and Milla.

Ray joined the Veteran's Tennis Association of SA in 1987 and Donna joined the following year. They played in

the Monday Night Mixed competitions, Donna played in the Tuesday Ladies and Ray played in the Thursday Men's B Grade competition. They were also regular players in the Riverland Carnivals at Berri for many years. It is only a few years ago that Ray's knees finally forced him to quit the **Grommets**. He was always very competitive, but also very fair and sporting. Off the court, his passion for his beloved Glenelg Football Club was often to the fore.

(We thank Donna for this summary of his football achievements.)

Ray won a Tiger medal when playing school footy for Ascot Park in 1958 for the best and fairest schoolboy player. While playing for Morphettville Park, his local

club, by the age of 21 he had won three best and fairest medals. In 1966, he was approached by a Glenelg scout Barry Mair, and promised to play the last three games in the seconds. In the first two games, he was in the best players and coach Len Fitzgerald was about to promote him to the league, but unfortunately for Ray, he was hit by the flu and couldn't play. The next year saw a change of coach to Neil Kerley, who liked rough and tough players, while Ray was a player that used to hand ball to move the game on and didn't



suit the coach as much. Ray played with and enjoyed a great friendship with Daryl Moss, Dennis Eblen, Brian Colby, Rex Voight, Kerry Hamilton, Nev Caldwell and so many more that it would take up too much space. In 1967, he played in a seconds premiership and then in the next two years played in the state seconds team. In 1971 he was awarded a Five year certificate as a player and in 1995 awarded Life Membership of the Glenelg Club. Ray played 26 league games and spent at least twenty years as an official and only retired from that area when Ben (son) started to play in the under age competitions, as he did not want conflict of interest, even though he still "helped" out with duties for the underage teams.

RULES FOR NON-UMPIRED MATCHES

- a) Each player is responsible for all decisions in his/her half of the court. He/she should be completely honest on all "calls" but, if in doubt, he/she should give his/her opponent the benefit of the doubt and play the ball as good. You should not play a let.
- b) It is your obligation to call all balls on your side, to help your opponent make calls when the opponent requests it, and to call against yourself (with the exception of a first service) any ball that you clearly see out on your opponent's side of the net.
- c) Any "out", "let" or "fault" call must be made immediately (ie made before either an opponent has hit the return or the return has gone out of play); otherwise the ball continues in play. "Calls" must be verbal and clearly audible to the opponent, followed by a signal if necessary. "Lets" may be called by any of the participating players.
- d) On all court surfaces except clay (see (g) below) if a player incorrectly calls a ball "out" and then realises that the ball was good, the point should be replayed on the first occasion (involuntary hindrance) and the point lost on each subsequent occasion (deliberate hindrance). In the case of a point winning shot, a let would not be played.
- e) In doubles, when returning service, the partner of the receiver should generally call the service line for him/her. The receiver should generally call the centre and side service lines.
- f) If players cannot agree on the score, they should calmly discuss the points/games that are the areas of disagreement. If they cannot reach agreement they should replay only the points or games in question. All points or games which the players agree on stand. eg Two players cannot agree on whether the score is 40-15 or 30-30, but agree on the winner of the first, second and fourth points. Therefore only the third point needs to be replayed.
- g) Players are prohibited from checking the mark of the ball on their opponent's side of the court, unless invited by their opponent to do so. Ball mark inspections are only permitted on clay courts. On clay courts if a player incorrectly calls a ball "out" and then realises that the ball was good, the player who called "out" loses the point.
- h) Where a ball interrupts play, either by rolling/bouncing onto the court, and/or creating a visible interruption behind the court a let should be played. Where this is between a 1st and 2nd serve, therefore providing only minimal interruption, a second serve only would be played.
- i) If a player hinders his/her opponent, it can be ruled involuntary or deliberate.
- j) When a player has created an involuntary hindrance (ball falling out of pocket, hat falling off etc), the first time a "let" should be called and the player should be told that any such hindrance thereafter will be ruled deliberate.
- k) Any hindrance caused by a player that is ruled deliberate will result in the loss of a point.
- l) Foot faults may only be called by an official standing on court. The receiver cannot call a foot fault against a server.
