# President's Report to AGM

### **TENNIS SENIORS' COMMITTEE**

The Committee works tirelessly on your behalf and I want to thank each member. They have gone above and beyond the call of duty to make Tennis Seniors a well-run organisation for all of us to enjoy. I particularly mention two committee members who are not continuing:-

John Butterworth, who held the position of Immediate Past President. His work has been invaluable and I thank him for his personal support. Tony Murphy undertook a great workload and his expertise on many matters was very important to the work of the Committee.



### PLANNING

The Committee is developing a plan for the next three years. There is a draft on the website and you are invited to contribute your comments and ideas before finalising it. Your input will be most valuable. The most important things to think about are:

• Continuing to attract members to Tennis Seniors - social and competition players.

- How to improve the facilities at South Park.
- Encouraging increasing regional membership and participation.
- Developing our partnerships particularly with Adelaide Hockey Club and the Adelaide City Council.
- Attracting sponsorship to support our activities.

The Committee is very keen have a plan for the future in place which enables the Association to increase its capacity to provide better facilities and opportunities for senior tennis players to enjoy the game and each other's company.

### MEMBERSHIP

Our membership is very healthy at 591. The Committee is keen to grow this number and particularly increase the number of female members. So if you know someone who might be interested please get them involved.

### **REVIEW OF CONSTITUTION**

Tony Murphy and Rob Crawford reviewed the Association's Constitution. This document has not been reviewed for many years and the proposal for a new one is before you tonight.

### ONE LICENCE

The Committee is also working with the Adelaide Hockey Club to investigate the idea of having the liquor licensing come under one common licence. It's early days, but there are some benefits in having one licence rather than the separate licences we currently have.

### WORKING PARTY

Tennis Seniors' SA and the Adelaide Hockey Club will be forming a joint working party to look at the future of the South Park facility in the light of the Adelaide City Council's Master Plan. David Cadman, Rob Crawford and John Haren will represent TSSA on this working party.

### SOLAR PANELS

The Committee worked diligently on the issue of solar panelling for the South Park complex. This was made possible by securing grants for the panels. Thanks particularly to John Butterworth, Dennis Haupt, Tony Murphy and Rob Crawford for putting in countless hours on this project to achieve a successful outcome in collaboration with the Adelaide Hockey Club. This was a joint process with Hockey and we value their expertise in securing the grants. In the long run, this will save costs for us.

### **ADELAIDE HOCKEY CLUB**

Our relationship with the Adelaide Hockey Club is a solid one and from the meetings I have been involved in so far, I know that that is reciprocated by the hockey leadership.

There's been a lot of work put into our licensed premises to ensure that we are aware of our responsibilities and compliant with regulations. The Committee is working hard on your behalf to ensure this.

### PARKLANDS PLANNING

The Adelaide City Council is going through a very thorough process of looking at future uses of the parklands - our interest and involvement in this is high. We have a prime facility which we want to grow and encourage even more people to use it. We will continue to work with the Council on future plans for the South Park site.

### REGIONAL

The strength of regional participation in seniors' tennis in SA is very heartening. The Berri carnival has been a longstanding successful event on the calendar but there are many examples throughout the State of impressive participation. Congratulations to Murray Bridge seniors on their twenty year celebrations.

### NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Congratulations to all participants in Hobart. South Australia was well represented in settings that were spectacular for tennis. We had some welldeserved winners and our participation numbers were high. The South Australian dinner was well attended and enjoyed by all.

We look forward to a strong representation for 2015 in Canberra.

John Haren, Lorna Harmer, Helen Schreier, Janet Wang and John Butterworth represented the City.

John Haren chaired the meeting, welcoming all the country representatives.

All Divisions gave a report on their activities over the last twelve months. South East Division emailed their report to the Secretary, written by the previous President Tut Agnew. Sharon Jenner advised that the Barossa Division was in abeyance for winter, she will try to get it going in the summer. John Butterworth advised that the Fleurieu Division had fallen over - their President had moved out of the area and Scott Nottle, the instigator of the division, was unavailable.

# LORNA HARMER

Lorna joined the Veterans Association of SA 19<sup>th</sup> November 1990

Previously played for Ascot Park Methodist Church at sixteen years old, also played for Xavier, Keswick & Wayville, Walkerville Lawn and Tranmere Lawn.

Lorna played in the Tuesday night competitions for ten years.

Represented South Australia playing in the Australian Championships in SA and other states for seven years

Took over from Dean Billing in 2002 as Treasurer with a membership of 550.

Managed the finances for the construction of six new courts in 2008/2009.

The following twelve years from 2002 to the present 2014 carrying out the Treasurers responsibilities which are:

- Finances of the South Park Seniors Tennis Centre with a membership of 549 at 30/6/12
- Tennis Seniors Association of SA Inc;
- Tennis Seniors and Adelaide Hockey Club.
- Tennis Seniors and Adelaide Hockey Maintenance Fund
- Tennis Seniors and Adelaide Hockey Court Replacement Fund.

The time that the above work takes is considerable, especially when this year the Tennis Seniors Association of SA had to be separated into two separate identities; Tennis Seniors Association of SA Inc and South Park Seniors Tennis Centre.

This work has taken nearly nine to ten months to achieve as asked for by Tennis Australia/Tennis Seniors Australia. Our books now consist of accounts for Tennis Seniors SA Association, and South Park Seniors Tennis Centre (the club) plus a consolidated set (adding the two together)

Lorna also controls the books for the six court agreement with Hockey and is the first person we seek to check the finances for the main consortium, for which Pulteney School do the books, but we have to agree with them. The consortium which run the finances for the twelve courts consist of Pulteney Grammar School, Adelaide Hockey Club and Tennis Seniors SA

Presenting monthly Treasurers Reports to the Committee meetings consisting of the above and as follows:

Social Reports and night competitions:- Lorna receives all monies from these events and the State Championships.

Match Reports: From five coordinators that run the competitions four nights a week, as well as Wednesday and Thursday mornings, including all match fees and renewal subscriptions.

# JOHN BUTTERWORTH

Joined Tennis Seniors 1990.

On social committee for approximately seven years, canteen subcommittee ten years and chair of grounds sub-committee for five years.

In 1994 was on sponsorship committee for Australian Championships.

In 2000 and 2009 chaired transport committee for Australian Championships.

In 2003 came on general committee and has been there since, making it twenty years on committees and sub-committees.

Has been principal coordinator for annual City v Northern Areas annual match for fifteen years. Instigated purchase of perpetual trophy for that event.

Tennis Seniors SA delegate to Tennis Seniors Australian AGM

TSSA delegate to Tennis SA for five years.

Became President TSSA in August 2008 in time for Australian Championships in 2009, working with Brian Dew to conduct these.

Instigated self-controlling system for Tuesday Social Tennis (12 courts used).

Prepared and signed Service Agreements with Tennis SA.

Attended quarterly consortium meetings with consortium partners Pulteney Grammar School and Adelaide Hockey Club.

Had meetings with Adelaide City Council arranging Sporting Licences and leases for courts and clubhouse and completed future development surveys for use of court area in South Parklands.

Instigated TSSA joining Clubs SA with training for committee in Responsible Service of Alcohol and provides an avenue for grants for facility improvements.

Captained teams at Australian Carnivals since 1996.

Chaired task force to provide courts and facilities for 2011 Australian Masters Games at South Park and acted as court supervisor for the event.

Initiated in May 2012 what is believed to be the first men's daytime mid-week competitions in Adelaide (not just Seniors) with two divisions playing on Wednesday and Thursday mornings all year round - co-ordinates/ plays in both.

In May 2013 initiated establishment of Tennis Seniors Fleurieu Region in Port Elliot and in November 2013 Barossa Tennis Seniors Region in Lyndoch. Currently negotiating to establish a Region in Gawler and for their annual tournament to meet Tennis Seniors status as a National Ranking Event..

Initiated proposal for solar panels on clubhouse roof to minimize power bills.

Under Tennis Seniors SA constitution, the maximum term for President is five years and so John stood down in August 2013 as President, but remained on the committee as Immediate Past President and has taken on the portfolios of selector and fostering country regions.

John plays in Seniors competitions Monday nights, Wednesday and Thursday mornings and Thursday nights.

# Weekly Competitions

### WINTER COMPETITIONS

At the time of this report, all competitions have completed their seasons.

### Monday Mixed: -

### Monday Men's A Grade: -

*Wombat's Mob* finished in top position on 80 points from *Hot Chillies* on 62 points, after a season with a number of washed-out matches in spite of catching up some of those matches during the mid-season break. Players for *Wombat's Mob* on the final night were Rino Trafforti, Trevor Reeves, George Bouras, Mark Inglis and Ian Delbridge.

### Wednesday Ladies: -

**Black** (Angelique Foran, Judy Raggatt and Leonie Millard) continued their dominance on the final night and play was called off when they were in an unbeatable position in their match against *Green*.

### Wednesday B Grade Men: -

The B1 final was won by *Eagles* (David Mullins, Graham Sando, Anthony Klatt, Ian Campbell and Phil Smith), defeating *Grand Slammers* (Evan Tyack, Peter Stanford, Julian Morison and Bill Borgas) 5 sets 38 games to 1 set 27 games.

*Eagles2* (Jonathon Mann, Trevor Weinert, Mark Lukins and Adam Chan) were successful in the B2 final, defeating *Old Bucks* (Paul Annandale, Steven Evans, Stephen Davel and Bruce Oldfield) 4 sets 39 games to 2 sets 34 games.

### The daytime Open Competitions played two half seasons in winter:-

Division 1 saw *Stars* win the first season with 35 points to *Champs* on 32 points, but partway through the second season, *Champs* are leading after five rounds with 21 points to *United* on 20 points, although the latter team have played one less match. With another four weeks, this competition is wide open.

*Alan's Flock dominated* the first Division 2 season with 50 points to *The Musketeers* on 35 points. With three matches still to play before their final in the second season, *The Musketeers* lead *The Moulton Men* 32 points to 27 points.

Each of these competitions has shown that playing and enjoying their tennis is more important to most players than winning the proverbial sheep station.
