President's Report

I was at the recent Australian Open enjoying the atmosphere of an event which is very significant in world sport. With over 700,000 people attending during the two weeks of the tournament, I understand that it is the most attended annual sporting event in the world. The crowds are energetic and enthusiastic in following the matches. People come from far and wide to enjoy the skills of all involved. Whether you are at Rod Laver Arena watching Roger play, or Court 22 watching two players you've never heard of from countries you're not even sure of where they are, it's impossible not to get caught up in the excitement of seeing a sport played at the very limits of human skill,



movement and fitness. The TV audience for the Final was 3.37m with another 4.1m internet streams during the fourteen days of the tournament. There is incredible interest in this event from all age demographics.

Those of us playing seniors' tennis still enjoy pushing the limits of our tennis skills as well as enjoying the competition and social interaction of the sport that many of us have played since we were young children. However, we all know that there are many who started the tennis-playing journey, just as we did, and for one reason or another, did not continue. Seniors' tennis presents a great vehicle to encourage those people to re-join the tennis playing community. And there are many who have done so. Others may continue to witness the Australian Open as a wonderful event, but not even think to move from being a spectator to a player. Our task is how to turn tennis from an event into an activity with more people of all ages participating. We know that our society has changed in many ways with different and longer working hours; many more sporting and entertainment options; people being very conscious of time that they commit to particular activities; attention-spans reducing; and many more influences.

In marketing terms, it would seem that tennis is a good product – at least for watching the elite performers. Is it a good product for participation? It offers:

- Skill development
- Competition
- Social engagement
- Fitness development
- Opportunities for all ages

These are all ingredients that are important in the development of a healthy lifestyle. The fact that you can play the sport from a very young age into old age is a great thing to be valued. Tennis Seniors' in SA has a healthy membership base but we can always grow. As the baby boomers retire, it's an opportunity for people to resume tennis careers they may have left previously, or to play more tennis if they have maintained their involvement. The challenge really is how do our children and grandchildren engage with the support? How do we all turn an event in January, that has so much interest, into a sporting activity that is part of more peoples' lives?

During the chatting, Angelique asks "would you like to play in a mixed doubles event with me in a few weeks time at Kensington. It's for charity". Four months later, we were playing at Melbourne Park (flights paid for) during the Australian Open in a semi final with six ball kids, six lines persons, and a chair umpire officiating. How could it possibly come to this? It got even better. The accreditation we had around our neck gave us almost free access to anywhere in Melbourne Park, including player locker rooms and cafeteria. - Simply Sensational.

Reports from Captains Australian Teams Championships January 2015

WINTER WEEKLY COMPETITIONS

It is time to nominate for our Winter Competitions which are due to start in the week beginning Monday 27th April 2015 on Monday and Wednesday nights as well as Thursday and Friday mornings. Nomination forms are included with this issue and should be returned to your Competition Co-ordinator no later than the closing date. Your cooperation in meeting the deadline makes the task of planning, preparing draws and programmes much easier and saves lots of phone calls to check that teams (even regular teams) do intend to play and have just forgotten to nominate.

At this time, the format will be the same as previous winters, but a couple of interesting alternatives merit consideration. They both would lead to earlier finishes on those cold nights.

How about a switch to the new **Fast4 format**, playing six four game short sets with a five point tie-break at three all, instead of the normal six game tie-break sets? Not sure about "No-lets"!

A lot of doubles competitions are now using "No-Ad Scoring", where a deciding point is played at deuce with receiver choosing on which side to receive? In Mixed Doubles, man serves to man and woman serves to woman

If you have any thoughts about either of the above or have other suggestions how to finish earlier, discuss it with your teams, talk to other teams and your Coordinator.

Recent Tennis Australia Initiatives

To assist members to think about the *Fast4 format* with which I have had experience as an Official, I have included on Page 16 of this issue the Information supplied by Tennis Australia to explain the rules and how a match is played in this format. You may have seen it in exhibition matches, ATL matches or ask Ian Delbridge and Angelique Foran how they found it during their AO2015 experience.

My advice as an Official was sought recently on the temperature at which play should be suspended/cancelled. I have attempted to summarise TA's Extreme Weather Policy updated last September on Pages 16 and 17, but for the full policy, I suggest you go to their Website, www.tennis.com.au where you will find a full explanation of terms, the philosophy behind the policy, wet weather suspensions, lightning and other hazardous circumstances. Well worth a read.

Fast4 Match Formats and Rules

The objective of the Fast4 format is to create faster paced matches for competitors so players can play more matches within a shorter space of time. Also, by using some different rules as outlined below, players get a slightly different tennis playing experience.

Please see below the specific rules for the Fast4 format;

No Lets

When a player is serving and the ball clips the net tape and lands in the point will continue. If the returning player forgets the rule and catches the ball then the serving player will be awarded the point.

No Advantage - Receivers choice

If a game gets to deuce, the winner of the next point will win the game. The receiver will get to choose which side of the court they will receive the serve from.

Best of three, first to four game sets

To win a set a player must win four games. At three games all, a tie break will be played. To win a match, a player must win two four game sets.

First to five point tiebreak

At three games all when a tie break is played, it will be a first to five point tiebreak. The tie break will be played using the following rules;

Player A serves the first two points, Player B serves the next two points.
 After four points players swap ends. Player A then serves another two points. If neither player has reached five points then Player B will serve three points. If the tie break score gets to four points all then the receiver chooses which side they will return from. A player does not need a two point lead to win the tiebreak.

Sitting Down during match

Players are not allowed to sit down between games. They are only able to sit down at the end of the set.

Extreme Weather Policy – September 2014

This Policy relates to tennis tournaments, competitions and events conducted by or on behalf of Tennis Australia, Member Associations, affiliated organisations, member affiliated organisations, regional associations and affiliated clubs. It is designed to protect competitive tennis players from injury and illness that may result by playing tennis in extreme weather conditions. The policy recognises that all players can be at risk.

Extreme weather (heat, lightning, wind and as a by-product smoke) can pose a health risk. Although the risk of heatstroke in tennis is low, playing in hot and humid conditions in particular can impair the body's ability to lose heat. Older players in particular, those with specific illnesses i.e. diabetes, heart disease, may also be at increased risk.

Competition/Tournament and event organisers have a duty of care to players, officials and other tennis participants, which include regularly monitoring environmental and playing conditions and acting to minimise the risk of heat stress or threat of illness or injury to players, officials and other tennis participants.

Extreme weather may be defined as including weather that threatens the immediate or long-term safety of individuals, as a result of rain, lightning, wind, heat or other unusual or unpredictable weather conditions.

Schedule Of Requirements And Recommendations For Extreme Heat

The following outlines the minimum requirements which will determine the activation of this policy in relation to extreme heat at tournaments. It also takes into account the varying climate impacts across Australia.

• For players over the age of 16 the following applies

- o Where the WBGT** is 30 C or greater -
 - Reduction of scoring formats to either a match tie break (10 point) at one set all (with or without no- ad scoring) or best of 3 short sets with no-ad scoring. Alternatively a 10 minute break between the second and third sets, in a best of three sets match must be provided.
- o All play must be suspended (on completion of the current game) and no further matches are to commence if:
 - The WBGT is 34 C or greater or
 - The Ambient Temperature is 38 C or greater

• For players competing in the over 60 (Super Senior) categories

- O Where the WBGT** is 30 C or greater
 - Reduction of scoring formats to either a match tie break (10 point) at one set all (with or without no-ad scoring) or <u>best of 3 short sets with no-ad scoring</u>. Alternatively a 10 minute break between the second and third sets, in a best of three sets match must be provided.
