SUMMER WEEKLY COMPETITIONS

Team competitions are played on four nights and two mornings in summer. Summer 2015/2016 competitions began on 12th October. There are spare courts on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday nights.

NIGHT COMPETITIONS

Monday is the mixed doubles competition, with six teams in Division 1 and another six teams in Division 2. After six matches, *Serves You Right* are clear leaders in Division 1, with *Tennis Tragics* and *Hit That* separated in second place only by games won. In Division 2, *Side Liners* are one point clear of *Footloose* at the top of that ladder.

Tuesday is Ladies' night, with four teams in Division 1 and six teams in Division 2; *Paragold* and *NE25-11is* are showing they are the teams to beat in Division 1, while *Spin 'n Win* and *Mixtures* are the leaders in Division 2.

Wednesday is the A Grade Men's night with seven teams in that competition. *Wombat's Mob* are currently top with 27 points from 4 matches, *All Sorts* have 23 points from 4 matches while *Hoo Ever* also have 23 points, but have played an extra match.

Thursday is the B Grade Men's competition, with eight teams in Division B1 and eleven teams in Division B2; one B2 team has a bye each week and the remaining eighteen teams play their matches on two courts. After seven rounds, the B1 competition is very close, with *Rabid Racquets* and *Power1* equal on points and set percentage, but slightly separated on games percentage. *Eagles Gold* are leading B2 competition with 41 points from 6 matches, *Eagles Blue* are second with 35 points from 6 matches, while *Crocks* are in third place, despite having more points than the second team, but have also played an extra match.

Co-ordinators for the night competitions are Barbara Mathews (8258 8806) (Monday), Gail Weinert (8391 2984) (Tuesday), Ian Delbridge (0402 362 011) (Wednesday), and Norbett Jahnke (8373 5363) (Thursday).

While teams have their regular players, many are looking for fill-ins, so this can be an avenue for new players to join in. The first two doubles in each night match are played as nine game sets with the other four doubles matches played as six game sets. After matches, the Clubhouse facilities are available, with members able to enjoy a drink or two while sampling a sausage sizzle on some nights as well.

DAY COMPETITIONS

This summer, the daytime Open competitions are continuing with some ladies again joining the predominantly men's competition, although the successful ladies team from the Division 1 Winter event are playing in their regular Summer competitions elsewhere.

Division 1 competition is being played by six teams of three players on a Thursday morning, playing two sets of singles and three sets of doubles. Chris Altman is the contact for this competition (8338 1535 or 0417 089 710). After seven matches, **Eagles** are leading with 36.5 points from **Crows** with 32.5 points and **Swans** with 31.5 points. Of course, the team squads tend to change on a regular basis, so it is just as well that they will not be playing finals as working out who is qualified for each team would be a Recorder's nightmare.

The Wednesday morning Division 2 Doubles competition, under the control of Bob May (8431 6346 or 0439 377 013) is being played by four teams, each of four players. They play six 6 game sets. They have also played seven matches and **Orrin's Newbies** with 35 points lead from **Bob's Mongrels** with 33 points.

Premiership ladders for those divisions which have a bye are based on points ratio and then percentages to allow for teams playing different numbers of matches. The ladders for all other divisions are sorted on points, then percentages of sets won. Players can check on their own team and individual results by logging in to the Tennis Australia Match Centre.

Changes for this Summer

The balls used in our competitions have been changed from Head to Wilson, as these seem to be favoured by more of our members. There has been an increase in the match fee for competitions from \$8 to \$10, partly resulting from the increased ball costs and other cost increases. This is the first increase for quite a few years.



AUSTRALIAN TEAMS CARNIVAL

SHEPPARTON 2016 TEAMS 10 - 15 JANUARY 2016

The 2016 Australian Teams Carnival and Individual Championships will be held in Shepparton from Sunday 10th to Friday 22nd January 2016.

The main host venue will be the Shepparton Lawn Tennis Club boasting twenty two top quality grass courts. It is adjacent to the recently developed Victoria Park Lake and alongside the Goulburn River, within walking distance of many motels, hotels, apartments, caravan parks and Shepparton's CBD.

The secondary venue for the Teams Carnival will be the Mooroopna Recreation Reserve located within ten minutes of the Shepparton Lawn Tennis Club. Forty grass courts will be set up on the sports ovals which have recently undergone major reconstruction.

Teams can play two matches per day, morning and afternoon, with a limit of two and a half hours per match. Matches shall consist of four (4) doubles rubbers played on two courts. Each rubber shall consist of two sets, first to six games with a seven point tie-break at five games all.

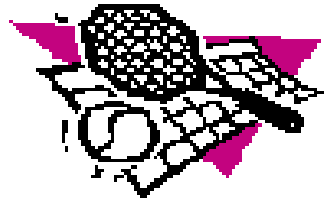
