PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am writing this watching Nick Kyrgios play against Richard Gasquet in the French Open. I find it fascinating (others might call it frustrating) to analyse the elements that make up the character of a tennis player.



We have all seen it at different levels of tennis – the talented player who has all the shots, but who can't quite get it together mentally. The consistent less-talented player who strives with

every sinew in their body to compete and make the opponent earn every point. The beauty of tennis is that it is never over until the final ball is struck. There is no time clock counting down the minutes and seconds to the end of the game. There is no timekeeper with finger poised over the button for the final siren. This provides openings for the player who is willing to 'hang in there' and fight to the very last stroke.

The game can be won from the depths of despair or lost from a position of overwhelming superiority. We've all played matches where we have been in seemingly insurmountable positions and lost. On the other hand, occasionally we can come back from nowhere to claim an unlikely victory. All this adds to the unpredictability, intrigue, frustration and enjoyment of tennis. It is a unique sport in so many ways. The camaraderie between players can be something to really celebrate as we develop long life friendships. Competition can be intense and at times create both highs and lows. Everyone loves to be a winner! But equally we are called to be sportspeople who exemplify respect for our opponents no matter how much we want to beat them. It's a fine balance to achieve.

Tennis Seniors overwhelmingly offers players the opportunity to compete, socialise and enjoy the game late into our lives. It can be still as exhilarating to nail a volley or hit a sweet backhand passing shot at age 60 as it was when we were 20! But, the mature age senior tennis player understands that respect for the game and your opponent is a critical and core element of both enjoying the game and achieving longevity as a successful player.

As I write, the immensely talented Kyrgios loses to the level headed Gasquet. Nick could do worse than take a leaf out of the seniors tennis player's play book that enjoyment of the game and respect for your opponent are paramount.

I hope all members continue to enjoy their tennis in the wake of Berri and in the lead up to the 2017 National Carnival in Adelaide. Our lights at South Park have been upgraded and we have a grant application in with the Office of Sport and Recreation for the surface upgrade. The surface has deteriorated much more quickly than anticipated due to the increase in useage experienced in recent times. It is great to see Seniors tennis so popular and that we continue to enjoy the game into our latter years. Keep striving till the last point!
