## From The President

Tennis faces many challenges in its attempts to gain its slice of the sporting and entertainment market around the world. The big events that involve Federer and Nadal incite huge interest from people all over the globe. Yet we know that as work patterns change and other sports increasingly compete with tennis for participants, local clubs are going out of existence or amalgamating.



Australia is regarded as a nation that has a high

priority on sport. Tennis Seniors has a proud history in attracting a viable membership to create opportunities for play for a diverse range of playing standards. The next generation of tennis seniors have some different characteristics that we need to be mindful of as we continue to grow. It is important that we take heed of these issues and have plans to address them.

Mindful of this, the Management Committee is undertaking a strategic planning process at the moment. Some of the key themes that are emerging are:

**Membership** – how to increase membership and participation, particularly amongst women and younger players?

**Tournament play** – how can we generate increased participation in tournaments, particularly the State Championships?

**Communication** – how can we communicate effectively with members and attract a wider audience in an age when most of us are subjected to information overload? **Fees** - how do we set fees that are reasonable and equitable, but realistic enough to allow the organisation to be viable and grow.

**Regional development** – how can we better support tennis seniors in regional SA, where seniors tennis is often the backbone of the tennis community?

In the longer term can we develop the South Park clubhouse and offer an improved social atmosphere where people want to spend more time?

The strategic planning subcommittee is having conversations with Tennis SA in order to align the thinking of the two organisations. There has been a growing connection with Tennis SA and it is important that there is alignment in the vision and strategy between ourselves and the peak body.

If you have thoughts about any issues in relation to the development of Tennis Seniors then please communicate them. It is important that the membership participates in setting the future directions.

We have developed new structures and processes in relation to our Consortium partners Pulteney Grammar School and the Adelaide Hockey Club. New and more effective decision making processes will lead to better outcomes for all parties. The Consortium is about to sign a new lease agreement with the Adelaide City Council after considerable discussion about the structure of that agreement.

The new surface at South Park will be groomed shortly which will help to even out the surface and the bounce. We are still in the settling down phase and still expect improvement in the speed and bounce. Testing will take place early in the New Year to ensure that the courts are performing to acceptable standards.

To those who are going to the Australian Championships, do SA proud and have a good time.

## SUMMER 2017/18 WEEKLY COMPETITIONS

Again, the start of the Season was delayed, but only by one week because of removal of asbestos and re-assembly of the kitchen in the Clubhouse. So far, matches are going smoothly on each of the four nights, as well as Wednesday morning. The Thursday morning players have chosen to play matches among those players who arrive each week, rather than committing themselves to be in a team for the complete season.
