Four of the Tennis Seniors SA's Committee Members have announced their retirement after many years of valuable service on the Management Committee

- **John Haren** is about to complete his five year term as President and will step down as president in accordance with the TSSA constitution. He will continue in a Past President role on the committee for the coming year.
- **Sue Hand** has played a major role in organizing Social Activities and Fund Raising for Tennis Seniors since 1997. She has managed these activities for TSSA since joining the Committee in 2006. Sue will step down from the Committee, her social and fund raising roles post AGM 2018.
- **Chris Cave** will also step down from the Committee and her roles as Meeting Minute Recorder and caring for the South Park Clubrooms.

- **Louis Kemenyvary** has resigned from both the Committee and his role as Grounds man for South Park. Plans are progressing for the Consortium to employ a part time grounds man.

DENNIS HAUPT

Awarded Most Outstanding 35+ Tennis Senior (SA)

Here is the presentation made to Tennis SA in support of his nomination.

Dennis Haupt was Vice President of Tennis Seniors SA (TSSA) in 2017 (a position he has held since 2002). During this year Dennis's efforts contributed significantly to improvements in TSSA's facilities. This has enhanced both the playing conditions at our TSSA venue and its visual attractiveness. Overall, this has improved our public profile and has the potential to attract increased TSSA membership and to provide a solid base for the future of TSSA.

Replacement of a large part of the carpet playing surface at South Park 20 was a major project during 2017 and Dennis was a significant participant in this project. This playing surface houses 18 of our 24 courts and is used by TSSA, Adelaide Hockey (AH) and Pulteney Grammar School (PGC), which together comprise the Consortium that manages the Park 20 grounds. Dennis was a TSSA representative on the Consortium and the TSSA member on the Project Team that managed the resurfacing project. These bodies had to resolve difficult issues brought about by the different interests and views of the Consortium members. TSSA had responsibility to provide a surface that was appropriate for tennis and Dennis was prominent in arguing for TSSA's interests. This resurfacing project is completed now and the new 18 courts have already resulted in a fresh, attractive appearance for the venue.

Dennis also acted as Maintenance Supervisor in 2017 with responsibility for grooming the courts regularly and preparing them for Tennis Seniors events (South Australian Tennis Seniors Championships and the Australian Seniors Championships in January 2017). The Australian Championships in particular were a major event attracting almost 1000 players. Dennis not only played in the Teams Carnival, but also spent much of his "resting time" tending to equipment during the event. Dennis was also responsible for the maintenance of the large club house and its facilities. Maintenance and repairs are very much back room activities and are unexciting to perform, but they are essential for providing a clean, functional environment for the enjoyment of players. Dennis's Maintenance role was integral in presenting a functional and attractive venue for TSSA members and is essential in our goal to attract new members.

In November 2017 Dennis was also convenor of the South Australian Seniors Tennis Championships. He has performed this role many times in previous years and his experience and skill in this role resulted in a very smoothly run tournament enjoyed by the participants.

Dennis has reduced his tennis playing in recent years because of injury. However, he played very competitively in 2017 as a player in the 2017 Australian Teams Carnival and in the 2017 Berri Teams Carnival.

Dennis has shown strong integrity in carrying out his responsibilities. He has always argued and acted strongly for TSSA interests. In his Consortium negotiations in particular, he has considered the overall interests of the Consortium and tried to balance Consortium goals with TSSA needs.

Overall, Dennis is worthy of the Most Outstanding 35+ Senior South Australian Award. His activities have resulted in many improvements in TSSA, which have provided a base for the future success of TSSA.



2019 Australian Seniors Championships

Shepparton

The Australian Seniors Teams Carnival and Individual Championships will be hosted by Tennis Seniors NSW on the excellent grass courts of Shepparton in Victoria. The Teams carnival will run from 7th - 11th January with the Opening Ceremony and practice on 6th January. The Individual Championships will run from 13th - 28th January.

Why is NSW hosting an event in Victoria? Technical issues with facilities at the main Newcastle centre have forced a late change of venue for hosting the Championships. However, despite extensive research, no other NSW centre could offer sufficient courts in close proximity to host the 100+ teams that attend the annual Championships

Across the border, Shepparton was ready, willing and able to offer support to Tennis Seniors once again. They LOVE having us there – it stimulates their economy! The Greater Shepparton City Council has come on board with support of all kinds – from administration personnel to marketing and funding. Ian Grose, the President of Shepparton Lawn Tennis Club and curator of the courts, has a team of volunteers that are happy to serve us again!

Shepparton Lawn Tennis Club is one of Victoria's premier grass court tennis venues with twenty two grass courts. 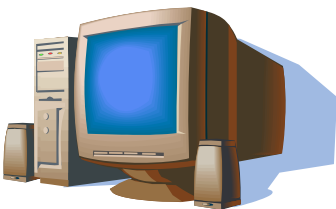

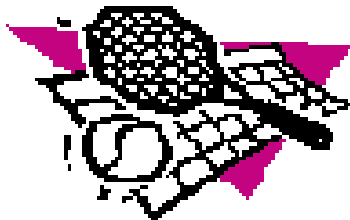
