Annual Report From The President

This is my last report as President of Tennis Seniors SA. It has been a privilege to serve in this role of the last five years. It is a time of transition and we have challenges ahead, but we have much to look forward to as we build the future on a very solid platform.

The positive attributes of our Association:

- Strong and stable membership.
- A core group of willing volunteers.
- Ability to attract grants to upgrade facilities.
- A Consortium structure that is taking greater responsibility for the South Park facilities.
- A strategic plan that positions Tennis Seniors SA for a healthy next five years.
- A growing relationship with Tennis SA.
- An emerging relationship with Adelaide City Council.



Tennis Seniors SA can be proud that we provide a wide variety of opportunities for Seniors' players to enjoy the sport we all love. The balance between providing competitions, social tennis, tournaments, State representation at National Championships, and, for some, even International competition is a rare mix of opportunities for players of all standards.

We are in a changing social landscape. There are many pressures in modern society that challenge us:

- Competition from a range of other sports and other leisure activities.
- Managing the competing pressures that intrude on our daily lives.
- Endless demands on our time.
- The propensity for people to cease playing sport into their middle and later adult years.
- The ability to attract volunteers into the future.

Partnerships are key to Tennis Seniors SA's development. We cannot exist in isolation, so our participation in the re-structured Consortium, growing our relationship with the Adelaide City Council, and continuing to grow our sponsorship base are critical to our future.

Our Management Committee has been outstanding and I want to pay tribute to each of them.

Louis Kemenyvary left the role of maintenance person and the Committee to move interstate. Louis put in countless hours to ensure that South Park functions efficiently. Louis's work often went unnoticed, but was vital to the centre operating effectively and Louis did it faithfully over many years.

Sue McKelvie has taken on administration of the website and keeps it updated as the public face of the organisation. Sue goes about it with no fuss so that we can all be kept informed about the activities of the organisation.

Rob Crawford works with Sue to ensure that the publicity side of things is under control. Rob is incredibly adept at writing stories about identities in the Tennis Seniors' world. He has been involved in many grant submissions and his wise counsel is always appreciated.

Janet Wang puts in countless hours as Secretary. Tracking the email traffic alone is almost a full time job and Janet is diligent and dependable in that crucial role of keeping on top of our communication. Her many years of service are greatly appreciated.

Chris Cave has worked alongside Janet to produce our Management Committee minutes which are critical to the recording of discussions and decision making. Chris has also worked with others to ensure that the clubrooms are spick and span, as well as being involved in supporting other activities.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

HELD AT SOUTH PARK CLUBROOMS

The Annual General Meeting of the Tennis Seniors Association of SA Inc was held on Tuesday 21st August 2018 at the South Park Clubrooms – there were 33 members and visitors in attendance, including Steve Baldas from Tennis SA and Lynton Franzi, representing Tennis Australia.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

John Haren presented his Presidents Report for the year 2017/18, which is his last report as he has to retire according to our Constitution. (see pages 3,4 and 5). He highlighted the Positive Attributes of our Association and the fact that we are in a Changing Landscape. There are a number of short and long term challenges to our Association. Finally, John summarised the role that each Committee Member has played in the last year, and in some cases for many years.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer Roger Sanderson presented his Financial Report (copy available on request). He spoke about the five year lease held by the Consortium, the Operating Profit for the financial year, our Operating Revenue and Expenditure, a Review of our Operations and presented the audited Financial Statement to 30th June 2018

MEMBERSHIP FEES:

The Treasurer and Committee recommended that Membership fees for the 2017/2018 season remain the same, \$70.00. Tennis Seniors SA Association fees will rise from \$20 to \$25. Non-playing membership \$20, Country affiliation fee \$33 (inclusive of GST). The Saturday afternoon membership teams pay their own expenses (providing the players are all seniors members). South Park night match fees \$10, Tuesday social \$5 which includes lunch, Wednesday and Thursday mornings \$5.

HONORARIA

The Committee recommended that Honoraria remain the same as in 2017, namely Secretary \$1200, Minute Secretary \$300, Treasurer \$1,200, Membership Secretary \$700, Recorder \$700, Webmaster \$600.

Coordinators \$200 for one competition, \$300 for two competitions, \$400 for three competitions.

Tuesday social \$250, Tuesday social deputy \$100 (or \$50 each for two deputies).

There are three vacancies.

John Haren remains on committee as Immediate Past President for twelve months.

The meeting endorsed the Committee's recommendation to continue our Affiliation with Tennis SA and Tennis Seniors Australia.

Strategic Plan

Roger Sanderson presented and spoke to a Strategic Plan (see next page) being developed with Tennis SA to ensure the Association remains viable in the future. Steve Baldas, CEO of Tennis SA spoke to the relationship resulting from talks over six to twelve months and what assistance they can offer, particularly with running tournaments where finding volunteers is becoming more difficult.

Lynton Franzi talked about the need to grow, finding new members and expressed his view that we need new people in charge, with new ideas, and a diversity of age groups. A number of members asked questions and the lively discussion continued over supper.

Presentations were made to the retiring Committee Members, John Haren, Dennis Haupt, Sue Hand and Chris Cave in recognition of their years of support for the association.

A presentation was also made to Barbara Mathews, Monday night co-ordinator who is retiring after many years. She has fulfilled this role since taking over from Malcolm Beddome a long time ago.

Supper was provided by the Association Committee and organized by Sue Hand. Well done! Thanks to all who helped.

It was disappointing at the lack of nominations, resulting in a number of vacancies. For a big club of hundreds, it is sad that no one is interested in helping run the association. Without a full committee, it will be hard for the association to function.

WINTER 2018 WEEKLY COMPETITIONS

Night Competitions

At the time of preparing this report, all competitions have played their penultimate matches and have only their final night to go. This will be decided by the Co-ordinator and in some cases will be finals with first and second on the ladder playing off to determine the winning team. The positions on the Premiership Tables have been decided in all divisions.

Monday Night Mixed Doubles:

Tennis Tragics with twelve wins out of their fourteen matches are clearly top with a Match Ratio of 6.71 from *Footloose* who have won nine matches out of their fifteen matches and having a Match Ratio of 4.67. These two teams will play off on Final night.

Monday Night Men's A Grade Doubles: -

Moving this season from Men's B1 Division into Men's A grade, *Eagles* finished on top of the Table, with eight wins, three drawn matches and a Match Ratio of 5.07, from *Wombat's Mob* with six wins, four drawn matches and a Match Ratio of 4.62.

Wednesday Night Men's B Grade Doubles: -

Eagles 1 won twelve matches and sixty four sets to score a Match Ratio of 5.88. *Rabid Racquets* were a very close second, winning one less set and their Match Ratio was 5.81, a very close result. Their final should be compelling.

In Division B2 with six teams, *Tontine* were clear leaders over the latter part of the season, finishing with fourteen wins from the second-placed team *Eagles 2*, who were successful in ten of their matches with a much higher sets percentage than *No NRG*, who won more matches, but less sets.

Day Competition

CROWS had a very successful Winter Season, winning twelve matches, *MAGPIES* won seven matches, while *HAWKS* were third with five wins and *EAGLES* only managed three wins. Consistently having the same players certainly helped in this competition.

As a participant in any activity held by or under the auspices of Tennis Australia, a Member Association, an Affiliated Organisation, a Member Affiliated Organisation, a Regional Association or an Affiliated Club **you must meet the following requirements in regard to your conduct during any activity or event:**

1. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of fellow players, coaches, officials and spectators.
2. Refrain from conduct which could be regarded as sexual or other harassment towards fellow players and coaches.
3. Respect the talent, potential and development of fellow squad players and competitors.
4. Care and respect the equipment provided to you as part of your program.
5. Be frank and honest with your coach concerning illness and injury and your ability to train fully within the program requirements.
6. Conduct yourself in a professional manner relating to language, temper and punctuality.
7. Maintain high personal behaviour standards at all times.
8. Abide by the rules and respect the decision of the umpire, match referee or other adjudicator, making all appeals through the formal process and respecting the final decision.
9. Be honest in your attitude and preparation to training. Work equally hard for yourself and your team/crew.

Report presented by Lorraine Graetz

Nothing much has changed at our club over the past year. Our membership remains steady around the 27 members mark and our programme has virtually remained the same; meeting on the second Sunday of each month between October and April. The only difference to our programme is the inclusion of an extra twilight event, adding December to the January one already in place. As well as these monthly Sunday events, Lorraine Graetz also ran social tennis on Thursday mornings. This was open to anyone and although we mainly had club ladies and gents playing, we also had the occasional visitor attend. Numbers varied from six players to having four courts in action. Our membership is female heavy, with 18 females compared to 9 males and this shows strongly in our monthly attendance.

In November, we again hosted an event for South East and Riverland Senior Club, but this was poorly supported with mainly locals present.
