Australian Championships:

Congratulations to all of our members who represented SA in the recent Australian Teams Championships in Busselton. Seven teams were entered from SA with three of them winning their respective divisions. The captains' reports later in the newsletter demonstrate the overall success of our representatives.

Tennis Seniors/Tennis Australia issue:

As advised previously, the vote by state associations rejected the Tennis Australia proposal. At the AGM of Tennis Seniors Australia, held in Busselton in January, an entirely new TSA executive was elected. We are now waiting to hear from the new executive as to whether there will be any further consideration of the TA proposal.

Courts update:

Whilst the main surface has settled some more, there is still some uneven and low bounce. The surface manufacturer and contractor have assured us that the surface was laid according to all requirements. Max Foran, a member with a lot of experience in synthetic grass surfaces, is coordinating a trial on one of the courts to test removing the current sand and putting in a finer sand, which we expect will improve both the bounce for tennis and the roll for hockey. Pending the outcome of this trial, we will then plan future action. Members should be assured that we are addressing the situation.

Liquor Licence Requirements:

As advised via an email to members, due to changes to our liquor licence classification, we can no longer allow members to bring their own alcohol into the **Page Three**

club. Our barman, David Bryant, does an outstanding job ensuring that a range of beers and wines is available at very reasonable prices, so I encourage members to purchase these on competition nights.

This year it was decided to go with seven players in both the Men's 50/55 and 60 teams because of concerns over niggling injuries leading up to the Tennis Seniors National Carnival and the fact that not many of the participants would be able to complete a whole week of competitive tennis. This was proven quite handy early in the week, with Michael going down with a significant calf injury resulting in no more tennis for him during the week.

Our draw consisted of six teams in total, of which we played every team once to determine the final four positions, with playoffs for the finals.

Monday commenced with a solid win against NSW50, followed by the narrowest of wins by one (1) game against WA50(1) team. Tuesday resulted in two further wins against WA55(1) and QLD55 followed by another solid win on the Wednesday against WA50(2) team.

At that point in time, we had played one match at the new Busselton courts and two matches at both old Busselton Courts and Bunbury Tennis Club. Whilst SA50/55 team was the only undefeated team in our division, we finished the minor round in second position to WA50(1) team, which had a more convincing winning ratio.

We were then scheduled to play the tougher preliminary final against QLD55 team at Bunbury Tennis Club, where it was fair to say the bounce of the ball was extremely low. QLD55 team was made up of experienced foes, but natural grass courts are not their preferred surface, resulting in a comfortable win for SA50/55.



TSSA's TENNIS ETIQUETTE & RULES for NON-UMPIRED MATCHES

All Players are required to comply with TSSA's Tennis Etiquette & Rules for Non-Umpired Matches.

RULES FOR NON-UMPIRED MATCHES

All Players should be aware of the following basic principles when playing a match without a Chair Umpire: -

- 1. If in doubt, a player must give the benefit of any doubt to their opponent, particularly regarding line calls
- 2. Each player is responsible for all calls on their side of the net and must also help their opponent/s make calls if their opponent/s request it, provided however any player can call a "foul shot" (e.g. a ball bounces twice before being hit "not-up", ball has not reached the net when hit, or player's racquet hits the net) and that these calls occur in a timely manner
- **3.** Any "out", "let" or "fault" call must be made immediately (i.e. made before either an opponent has hit the return or the return has gone out of play), otherwise the ball continues in play. "Calls" must be verbal and clearly audible to the opponent/s, followed by a signal if necessary. A service "Let" may be called by any of the participating players.
- **4.** If a player incorrectly calls a ball "out" and then realises that the ball was "good", the point should be replayed, unless that point was a winning shot. However, if that same player has previously during the match incorrectly called a ball "out" and then realised the ball was "good", that player who again called "out", but realises the ball was "good", loses the point.
- 5. Players are prohibited from checking the mark of the ball on their opponent's side of the court, unless invited by their opponents. Ball mark inspections are only permitted on clay courts. On clay courts, if a player incorrectly calls a ball "out" and then realises the ball was "good", the player (and doubles partner where applicable) who called "out" loses the point.
- **6.** The receiver must play to the reasonable pace of the server, noting that there is a normal standard time of 20 seconds between points. Both players must ensure they restrict their warm-up time, minimise time between points and at change of ends.
- **7.** To avoid controversy over the score, the server should announce the game score before starting a game and the point score prior to serving for each point and must be loud enough for the opponent/s to hear.

8. If players cannot agree on the score, they should calmly discuss the points/games that are disputed. All points or games which the players agree on stand and only those in dispute should be replayed; i.e. two players cannot agree whether the score is 40-30 or 30-40 and disagree on who won the first point in the game. The game shall continue from 30-30 since both players agree that they have won two points each.

When the game score is in dispute, the same principles apply; i.e. two players cannot agree on 4-3 or 3-4 and disagree only on who won the second game. The match shall continue from 3-3, since both players agree that they won three games each. The player who received in the last game played will serve in the next game.

Where there is a score dispute, all participating players must make a reasonable effort to remember the actual score; i.e. points/games played.
