#### Age change means exciting times ahead for Seniors' Tennis.

The **TSSA Committee** approved the change to our TSSA Constitution on 16 February 2021 to reflect the lowering - by the International Tennis Federation (ITF), Tennis Australia (TA), and Tennis South Australia (Tennis SA) - for entry into seniors' tennis from age 35 to 30.

TSSA currently enjoys a strong membership base, but there are always many of us who are at or approaching the "nearly done" stage of our tennis-playing activities so we need a constant infusion of new blood.

By providing the opportunity for 30-year-olds to become not only playing members but to also contribute to administrative roles, this change is aimed at helping to ensure the long-term viability of our proud association.

And 30 is certainly not too old to start playing tennis. Individuals of nearly any ability can begin playing tennis (even competitively) at virtually any age and of course at TSSA we have facilities and playing programs to suit all-comers.

If necessary, we will tailor our competition and social programs to suit our younger members. Please welcome any new faces with open arms and a friendly smile!

#### 2020-21 Summer Season

#### WEEKLY COMPETITIONS

held at South Park Tennis Seniors Centre (Park 20)

We continued this season to manage COVID-19, a disease caused by a new strain of coronavirus whose source remains a hotly contested international, national, and state debate!

Our weekly competitions commenced on October 12<sup>th</sup> 2020 and fortunately, despite many sport competitions/tournaments in other states enduring various interruptions and cancellations, we successfully played our scheduled rounds.

#### Divisions B1 & B2 Men's Doubles

Well, what a year 2020 – 2021 summer season was!

Our Thursday night competitions commenced on October 15<sup>th</sup> and we played through to the summer holiday recess that commenced 20<sup>th</sup> December 2020.

18 teams registered and played hence all 18 courts were utilised.

Both B1 and B2 competitions were equally represented and thus no team had a bye.

This was an increase of two teams from the previous summer season 2019-20.

The majority of tennis players complied with the COVID-19 rules and there was universal compliance with the checking in procedures.

After the Christmas break, summer tennis resumed on 28<sup>th</sup> January 2021 with a 'Up Front Team Payment' for the remainder of the summer season.

Each Team was required to pay \$360 upfront (4 Players X 9 weeks = \$360), either directly into the TSSA bank account or in cash.

The response was excellent, with only one team unhappy to do so.

This meant that any team member could collect the score sheets and tennis balls and proceed directly to their designated court.

A list of designated courts for each team was left on the COVID check-in table.

Feedback was great, as teams could commence their 'warm up hit' much earlier, no waiting for the last player to pay, and there was less mingling of players in the club room.

Our finals were held on 25<sup>th</sup> of March.

Some short speeches were made.

Thanks to Ernst Stevenson for collating and entering the results into the system.

Thanks to Jay Taylor who sacrificed his 3<sup>rd</sup> set on occasions to man the bar.

Thanks to Michael Pocock for assisting in locking up and on occasions running the show.

Thanks to all the players for their participation.

Each team enjoyed a small pizza which has been a long-standing tradition of the finals night.
