1. WCTC made a submission to the **Community Sports Facilities Program** which was requested by Tennis ACT. The project proposed by the Club was for a new clubhouse.
2. WCTC has joined a pilot of the **Book a Court API Integration Pilot Expansion** with the purpose of resolving the lighting issues and improving the “booking delay”. There are currently 72 venues running off the API integration and are looking to expand this group of venues.
3. **Tennis ACT CEO Kim Kachel** is resigning from his role at Tennis ACT to take up new position as CEO of Tennis QLD. A Farewell will be held at the Southern Cross Yacht Club from 4-8pm on Friday 26 May 2023.
4. The Walking Clinic who sponsors the Canberra Tennis League are keen to replace exiting **Walking Clinic fence signage**. Tennis ACT requested expressions of interest by 2 May 2023.
5. WCTC received a **complaint** from a member regarding the club’s school holiday coaching sessions and the use of music during the sessions.
6. Will Maher from **Accelerate Physiotherapy** reached out to the Club regarding sponsorship/partnership opportunities. Max Rafferty has had discussion with Mr Maher and has a draft agreement for Committee approval.
7. Nominations are open for the **2023 ABC Canberra Community Spirit Awards** and close on 19 May 2023. At a time when good news can be hard to find, ABC is celebrating the individuals and groups making a difference in our communities via their local projects, volunteering and events.

President's Report

Progress with the Additional Four Courts

Early work on the project to build four additional court has commenced. As stated in the last Newsletter article, the \$800,000 funding now forms part of the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts' (DITRDCA) "Investing in Our Communities Program" which has been established to deliver the Federal Government's 2022 election commitments. The club, in conjunction with Tennis ACT, is required to complete a Application which will include plans, costs, and provide justification and benefits of the project. To have the necessary documentation to submit the Application, a Preliminaries stage of the project needs to be completed.

In recent weeks meetings and site inspections have been held with two project management companies who have experience in managing tennis court constructions. We are now waiting to receive quotations from both these companies which will outline the cost of undertaking the Preliminaries stage of the project.

Meetings and discussions have also been held with representatives of Tennis ACT, the DITRDCA, and the ACT Government, all of whom are stakeholders in the project. In addition, a presentation was recently given to the Weston Creek Community Council to outline the plan development and to provide community consultation.

A major objective is to have the Application submitted to the DITRDCA by the middle of the year but a lot more work and discussions are required. I cannot be more grateful for the work and commitment that Graeme Rossiter, Phillip Stephens, and Geoff Kotz, have invested in this project to date. It should be remembered that they are volunteering their time to this project to ensure appropriate planning occurs, and the club achieves a sound outcome for all its members and the community. Their efforts are truly appreciated.

ACT Government's Sport and Recreation Program

The ACT Government's Sport and Recreation unit has established a "Community Sport Facilities Program" which will provide financial support to a number of not-for-profit sport, recreation and community organisations to assist in the development of their sport and recreation facilities.

Tennis ACT (TACT) is preparing a submission on behalf of all the tennis clubs in the ACT which will seek funds from the program. TACT intends to limit their submission to the "Top 15" projects which will be selected from proposals submitted by all the ACT tennis clubs.

Our club has submitted an application seeking funds for the redevelopment of the clubhouse. The application proposes that the new clubhouse would to be located on the existing site. This project was identified by a large number of our members who responded to last year's survey as being the most important priority for the club.

It is difficult to determine at this stage whether the project will be considered by TACT to be in the "top 15". However, it is important to be part of the process and have our submission considered.

I would like to thank Phillip Stephens who invested considerable time preparing the submission on behalf of the club.

Net Replacement

Members may have noticed that a number of the damaged and worn out nets have now been replaced. Now that the work has occurred, we have decided there are a small number of additional nets that should also be replaced. Consequently, an order has been placed to purchase additional nets and these will be installed once they are delivered. Replacing the nets does take considerable time and effort and a very big thank you goes to Geoff Kotz, Graeme Rossiter, Phillip Stephens and Tim Harris who did the hard work.

Working Bee

A very big thank you to Geoff Kotz, Phillip Stephens, Karen Jameson, Stephen Hoy, and Judy Tregoning who turned up for the working bee on Saturday 15 April and did a great job trimming the shrubs surrounding the perimeter of the complex, and carrying out a general clean up of the grounds. The work was made so much easier with Phillip supplying the much-needed trimming equipment and a well organised team clearing the trimmings as quickly as they fell.

At the time of writing, a further working bee is being organised for Saturday 6 May to give the gazebos a much needed uplift and paint. Thank you to those who have volunteered for this important task.

Advertising Opportunities

Max Rafferty has been holding discussions with a local business who has expressed interest in placing advertising signage at the club. This is an opportunity for the club to expand its much needed finances while giving local businesses valuable publicity. Although the discussions are in the very early stage, it is hoped that more local businesses may see the benefit of installing advertising signage at the club.

This initiative is just part of the work Max, Tony Laudenbach and Mark Walton are undertaking to identify opportunities for encouraging local businesses to financially support the club.

Treasurer's Report

The Club's Cashflow Report for March & April, since our March 2022 Committee Meeting, is attached. The key features of this periods financial transactions and the related Club's financial position is summarised as follows:

- the Club generated significant income from new memberships and renewals consistent with our annual membership cycle
- our total expenses were less than half that of the preceding period which is to be expected for this period
- our largest expenses are for our combined utilities and services and remain unchanged at approximately \$5K
- the high income and low expenses for this period has created a large surplus of \$29.5K and a healthy bank balance of \$125K
- our operating expenses are balanced by our operating income so Club achieving operational cost recovery (a good state)

The improvements to our financial management over the last two months include:

- engaging with our League Captains to simplify managing quarterly league fee finances (some work yet to do)
- trialling options for simplified structure of our financial accounts to better inform the Committee
- engaging with our Internal Reviewer on EOFY expectations

The financial management initiative planned for the next two months (May-Jun) are:

- activating Club Debit Card to pay significant expenses rather than reimbursing Committee member (Committee concurrence sought)
- implementing simplified financial account structure and reporting
- presenting our financial reports and supporting records for annual internal review

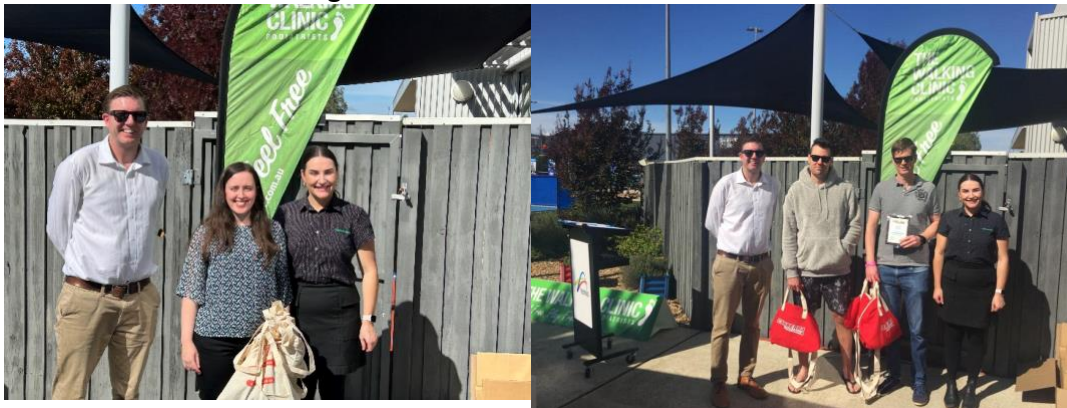
