

By popular demand, the event is on again and set to go on <u>Saturday 9th January 2021.</u>

#### **LINE CALLS: A CASE FOR BEING GENEROUS**

Many of us believe the hallmark of a FPTC member is one characterised by a sense of fair play at all times, good humour and generous club spirit.

It came as some surprise therefore when a few members, each separately, approached me recently on a matter causing them some concern. Essentially, their enjoyment of playing social tennis at the club is being marred by poor line calls that perhaps occur more often than they should. Fortunately this is happening only among a narrow band of players.

An incorrect call may sometimes occur if one is not suitably positioned in relation to the ball. At times like this, and in fact throughout your entire time on court, a sense of fair play must remain uppermost in your mind.

A generous line call from you will, more often than not, be reciprocated by your opponent(s). The reverse may also be true.

If you happen to be unsure about making an out call, give your opponent the benefit of doubt. When playing Doubles you may also consult your partner. Bear in mind it's the responsibility of each pair to jointly make consistently correct calls. If you regularly follow this approach your opponents will be less inclined to feel hard done by.

As a last resort one may ask the question of an opponent, or their partner, as to whether they felt sure about their line call. This should be done in a subtle manner, accept the response given and under no circumstance engage in any further conversation.

'Tis the season of goodwill, so time to make some lasting resolutions aimed at improving outcomes on this theme. To the vast majority of FPTC members who have always strived to be fair and often generous with their line calls, well done and continue to lead the way!

Whilst on the subject of fairness and etiquette let's briefly touch on foot faulting. With few exceptions, many of us are sloppy in our approach to this regulation and there is much benefit in acquainting ourselves with what's required to avoid falling foul of the foot fault rule.

If you don't think you're a 'Faulter' ask someone knowledgeable to watch you – you may be surprised with their summation, especially if you have that straying or sliding foot 'syndrome'. If this is you, stand much further back of the baseline when taking your service position. This may provide a better chance of keeping the transgressing foot (or feet) from making contact with the baseline or the court playing area before striking your serve.

So perhaps time for another resolution, the reward being a return to fair play and perhaps an incident free Club Championships in April (dates soon to be announced!)


