#### Vale Rob Cabion



Sadly, Rob Cabion passed away on the 29<sup>th</sup> May this year. Rob will be remembered as a wonderful tennis player who was passionate about promoting the game within our community and beyond.

Rob worked tirelessly for our Club, as a former president, a committee member and a player.

It was always a joy to watch Rob play. On the court, he was always supportive of his fellow players, whatever their ability level - encouraging them and offering advice when asked. His team mates in Mt Beauty and Albury will miss him greatly. In recognition of Rob's contribution to our club, he has been awarded life membership posthumously.

**Rob Cabion – Citation** (to be presented posthumous at the AGM)

- 1. Rob served as Mount Beauty Club President from 2009/10 to 2013/14 (4 years), only resigning when moving to Melbourne for work.
- 2. On his return to the Mount Beauty area, Rob served as a committee member from 2022 to 2023.
- 3. He liaised with Tennis Victoria to develop the club website using ClubSpark and linked this to our membership and court hire system.
- 4. Rob instigated and installed the Igloo lock court booking system.
- 5. In 2022 Rob obtained a AGL Community Grant to purchase three trestle tables.
- 6. Rob contributed to the lighting upgrade proposal and secured support from Tennis Australia.
- 7. Rob drafted the 2023 Business Plan.
- 8. Rob had amazing tennis knowledge. He was generous with his time, helping and advising the Section 1 K&TDTA team and encouraging other groups within the club.
- 9. Rob supported club competitions as an organiser and participant.
- 10. Rob initiated the purchase of the Ball Machine in 2011. In 2021, after finding that it was not being used, returned it to working order.
- 11. He contributed significantly to court maintenance in 2021/22.
- 12. Rob played a large part in the organisation of the club's Open Day in 2022.

#### 2. Court Spraying for moss, mould & algae



- 3. **Court renovation** The club schedules its tennis court maintenance every two years to keep its four synthetic grass courts in good condition. The contractor will be on our courts on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> September doing this work:
  - Clean-up of fence line, removal of debris;
  - Infill, filter and grooming treatment with Turf Soft TS2 machine (removes contaminates);
  - Sand top up around baseline;
  - Heavy machine broom grooming for quality finish (lifting the grass pile). Your membership fees at work.

## **Lighting Upgrade Project**

The club is planning to replace the eight (8) old Metal Halides lights that have been

operating since 1990 with eight (8) new 1000W 3 phase LED lights.

The process has involved sourcing the funds to get this done. The quoted cost is ~\$46.000.00. This has been happening over the last 18 months with an Alpine Shire Budget submission and an application to Tennis Australia through their Bushfire Community Development Fund (BCDF).

We have been successful with sourcing \$20,000.00 from the BCDF and the Shire is still considering its position.



When this project is completed playing at night will be like playing in daylight.

**4. Kiewa & Talgarno District Tennis Association Pennant Competition**This inter-town competition starts in October and continues throughout the Summer months. 2023/24 seasons starts on Sat 7<sup>th</sup> October. Sections 1 & 2 (Seniors) play Saturday afternoon, Sections 3 & 4 (Juniors) play on Saturday morning.


#### **Hot Shots**

This programme will be offered to children 5 – 12 years, commencing a few weeks into Term 4. We currently have two members, *Claire Lucas-Gear and Alison Kennet*, undergoing the training required to run this programme. It will involve 45 minutes of tennis activities, designed to improve skills and have fun.

The programme is still in the development stage so we will let you know further details at a later date.

#### **All about Balls**

1. Ball Machine — This was out of operation for some time but now has a new 12v Lithium battery and state of the art intelligent charger and is operating again. Please plug in the battery charger (plug is located lower left on the machine) when you have finished and press the MODE button on the charger. Please fill in the LOG Sheet. You need to use the special 'pressure-less' balls with the machine. It also has a REMOTE unit which is located in a plastic holder on the handle. There are instructions with the machine. Please read to learn how to operate it.



2. **Donation of old balls to local schools** — What do you do with old balls? The club donated 50 balls each to Mt Beauty PS, Tawonga PS, Falls Creek PS, Dederang PS and Mt Beauty SC.



3. **Ball Clip Holder** – A useful accessory if you don't have a pocket or other location to place the second ball prior to serving. *Some juniors in particular place the ball on the ground - this is a dangerous practice as a person can stand on the ball and get injured*. A clip is the solution which attaches to the persons shorts or dress waist band at the back.





To purchase, search for Ball Clip on the Net or The Racquet Shop has them.

#### **Door Code & Access to Venue information - A Reminder!**

As previously mentioned in the last newsletter, the clubhouse can now be used by any member of the Club, whenever they are using the courts.

The code to the lock on the door of the clubhouse will be emailed to members as they join for 2023/24. Note — if you input the wrong code press C to clear then re-enter the correct code. For security reasons, please do not give the code to anyone else. If non-members start accessing the clubhouse, we will need to change the code.

Use of the venue is subject to the following conditions.

#### **Access to the Venue**

#### 1. Access to the Clubhouse by members

Members have access to the door code and are permitted to use the clubhouse amenities (kitchen, refrigerator, hot water, tea/coffee etc), facilities (toilets) and equipment (ball machine, radar gun, old balls and spare racquets). Members are required to leave the clubroom in a tidy state.

#### 2. Access to the tennis courts

This will only be permitted for the court, date and time specified within your booking confirmation. You will be provided with a PIN that will enable access to the court via the main gate entrance at the date and time specified within your booking confirmation. You must enter the PIN on the pin pad located at the main gate entrance. Once you enter your PIN, the pin pad will light green and the gate can then be opened. Your PIN will be active for 10 minutes prior to your booking time and expire 10 minutes after your booking time. If the main gate entrance is already open or unlocked, you must still enter your PIN prior to entering the facility.
