In or out?

Who is responsible for calling shots in or out?

The court etiquette in this regard is as follows:

- 1. Each player is responsible for calling shots OUT on his or her SIDE of the court.
- 2. If the shot is IN, do not say anything. If the shot is OUT, shout OUT whether or not you swing at or hit the ball.



What if you are NOT SURE if a ball is in or out?

When a ball bounces so close to a line that you don't know whether it was in or out, it should be played as a GOOD Shot. Do not ask to replay the point. Either have the courage to call it OUT or the DECENCY to assume it was in. Don't ask spectators what they think. If you ask your OPPONENT's opinion, accept it. It is better not to ask.

While it's rude to question your opponent's line calls if you really think you are being diddled, ask once, firmly: "Are you sure?" then move on.

Doubles — When returning service, the <u>partner of the receiver</u> should generally c<u>all the service line for him/her</u>. The <u>receiver</u> should generally <u>call the centre and side service lines</u>. The call needs to be loud enough to stop their opponents/partners from playing.

Hot Shots

This programme was offered to children 5 – 12 years for four weeks in Term 4 2023. Thanks to *Claire Lucas-Gear and Alison Kennett* who underwent the training required to run this programme. The programme was well attended and was a great success. Claire and Alison have agreed to run the programme again- dates are still to be confirmed. Racquet Fence

We have probably seen or heard about the fences and chairs at Falls Creek made from old skis and snowboards.

The committee would like to **experiment** with something similar at the courts but made from old tennis racquets attached to the fence — a WELCOME sign has been suggested made from racquets. Do you have any ideas?

Tennis has been a cornerstone of my family's involvement for a significant period.

My coaching portfolio includes state, national, and worldranked players, and I am well-versed in working with beginners, intermediate, and advanced players alike.

I had a coaching tenure spanning 12 years for the McDonald's squad. This involved coaching advanced kids from all clubs in an area under my direction. I possess a wealth of experience in guiding players of varying skill levels.

As a junior, I held the prestigious #1 junior ranking; I was an active member of the Victoria Junior State Squad for four years. I played Senior State Grade Pennant for years and won several country tournaments.

Noteworthy achievements include my son Daniel's ascent to the #1 U18 junior ranking and representing Victoria in the Linton Cup. Furthermore, Daniel played a pivotal role as the #1 player for Oklahoma State University USA, securing All-American honours and placing among the top 20 players in America.

Similarly, son Nathan achieved the #1 U16 junior ranking and represented Victoria in the Reid Cup. His journey continued as an Oklahoma State (USA) Division 1 player.

Both Daniel and Nathan attained world rankings before encountering setbacks due to injuries.



- It opens **online** on *Saturday, 2nd March, and closes on Wednesday, 13th March*, i.e. 3, days before the Championships. Please enter early to assist the organisers in working out the draw and pairings.

Over the Net (snippets of news around the club)


- 1. When leaving the courts It has been brought to the committee's attention that on occasions, the courts are left unlocked and the clubhouse similar. Please be a responsible member and check that the gate and door are locked on leaving.
- 2. Clubhouse cleaning Feel free to use the vacuum cleaner if you notice the carpet needing care.
- 3. Memberships: Families 16, Adult 78, juniors not in a family membership 15 and life members 12.
- 4. Australian Tennis Open We had some members attending for a day, i.e. Lisa & Callum Bowring, Peter Donnan, Eileen Johnson, Evie Nowicka, Rohan Luxton, Andy & Zelk Shuttleworth, Paul L'Huillier, and others the editor doesn't know about.



- 5. The display boards in the clubhouse have been updated, i.e. Life Membership and Club Champions.
- 6. Primary School court usage Three half-hour sessions per week in Term 1.
- 7. Secondary College court usage Four weeks, two 45-minute sessions/week in Term 1.
- 8. Night Mixed Tennis Held on Tuesdays and Wednesdays nights. It's huge!
- 9. Ladies' Thursday Tennis Looking for more players. It's very social.
- 10. Second-hand Balls for Sale \$2.00/can. The Money Bucket is on the table.
- 11. Members' usage of lights \$5.00/hour/court. When you Book a Court (free), you receive two PINs: a **Gate Access PIN** and a **Light Access PIN**. The light access PIN is entered on the Keypad to the left of the clubhouse door. Read the information.

- 13. Ball Machine It is getting plenty of use. Have you tried it yet? The club is purchasing 100 new *pressure-less* balls. *Normal balls are not to be used in the machine.*

Door Code & Access to Venue Information – A Reminder!

Any club member can assess the clubhouse whenever they use the courts for free.

The code to the lock on the clubhouse door will be emailed to members as they join for 2023/24. Note — if you input the wrong code, press C to clear, then re-enter the correct code. For security reasons, please do not give the code to anyone else. If non-members start accessing the clubhouse, we must change the code. If you have forgotten the code, please email the secretary, mtbeautytennis@gmail.com, and it will be sent to you.

Use of the venue is subject to the following conditions.

Access to the Venue

1. Access to the Clubhouse by members

Members have access to the door code and are permitted to use the clubhouse amenities (kitchen, refrigerator, hot water, tea/coffee

etc), facilities (toilets) and equipment (ball machine, radar gun, old balls and spare racquets). Members are required to leave the clubroom in a tidy state.

2. Access to the tennis courts (free to members)

Use your mobile phone and the **QR Code** on the gate, **OR** log on to the **club's website** and select Court Booking. You will be provided with a **Gate Access PIN** enabling access to the court via the main gate entrance at the date and time specified within your booking confirmation.

A **Light Access PIN** is also included when you book. The public and members all pay for the lights, i.e. \$5/hour/court. This fee is charged for a 7:00 pm or later booking.


Enter the PIN on the PIN pad, and press the **Confirm key** (bottom right) at the main gate entrance. Once you enter your PIN, the PIN pad will light green, and the gate can then be opened. Your PIN will be active for 10 minutes before your booking time and expire 10 minutes after your booking time.

If the main gate entrance is already open or unlocked, you must still enter your PIN before entering the facility. Please close the lock on exiting the courts with the

keypad facing outwards.
