Thriving Tennis Tour Seminar

On 4th June Dallas Newton and Mark Langdon attended the "Thriving Tennis Tour" Seminar held at the Royal South Yarra Tennis Club. This event was attended by numerous Melbourne metropolitan tennis clubs.

Topics covered included:

- Your Club Experience Successful Engagement with Prospective and Current Members
- Your Club, Your Vision, Your Plan
- Safeguarding Children
- Environment and Sustainability
- Grant Writing
- Coach Relationships
- Red Porous Court Maintenance

Dallas was also a Guest Speaker and spoke on the Club's experience piloting a "shared services" model with Tennis Victoria. Mark also won a \$500 Club Maintenance Voucher from Tennis Victoria to be used by the Club for the purchase of goods or services required by the Club.





Whitehorse Sport and Recreation Reference Group

Mark Langdon has recently been appointed to the Whitehorse Sport and Recreation Reference Group (WSRRG) for a term of 2 years.

The WSRRG comprises 10 representatives from various sporting clubs in the Whitehorse municipality and two councillors.

The purpose of the Group is to review or develop:



- The Sporting Facilities Guide (licence terms and conditions of all seasonal tenant clubs and casual user of Council's sports fields and/or pavilions)
- Council's approach to allocations of Council's sports fields and/or pavilions
- Council fees and charges for use of Council's sports fields and/or pavilions
- The approach to Council's management of leased facilities

The Committee believes Mark's participation will allow the Club to develop better relationships with the various Council representatives as well gaining insight into the Council's strategy for the use of its recreational assets and how this may impact the Club's own strategic direction.

Court Care - Pearlwort

You may have noticed that during the winter the pearlwort weeds become more prolific. Whist we regularly apply weed killer it is extremely difficult to control.


The problem appears to be worse between courts, more so than on the playing court surface. We believe this is because the area between the courts is not regularly bagged.



Therefore, it would be appreciated if you bag this area as well as the playing surface before and after play and between sets. Also, if you could physically remove any large pieces of the weed as this would be most helpful in reducing the infestation.

New By Law

The Committee recently approved the following By Law:



For ERT, EDWTA and Pennant Competitions:

- Team Captains, or Match Convenors, will be responsible for supplying the balls, required for Home matches, and obtaining any reimbursement from team members. Balls may be purchased from the Club.
- The Club will pay the affiliation and registration fees associated with ERT and EDWTA Competitions and not require reimbursement from the team members.
- The Members of Pennant Teams will be responsible for paying all fees required by Tennis Victoria for playing in this competition.

Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting is scheduled to be held on the 10th September. This date will be confirmed at least 30 days beforehand.

As well as presenting the annual accounts and electing a new Committee, Dallas will provide an update on the Club's Strategic Plan and future initiatives.

A free BBQ lunch and drinks will be provided as well as the opportunity to play social tennis.
