over the weekend so hopefully we
will be more successful in growing
the entrants for this Tournament in
the future.

This years event was drastically affected by rain with sets being shortened, however due to Noel's scheduling skill and a lot of hard work by Parents, and Referees moping the courts the Tournament was finished with no events cancelled.

I would like to thanks all those members of the Club who have given their time to make this Tournament a success and one of the major fundraising activities of the Club. The Club is still waiting for the Council to provide a timeline for repairs to Court 8. I will update you all when the information becomes available from the Council. The Club is also still waiting for the new keyless entry and security system provided by Council. There has been delays due to some technical issues.

The Committee is looking to simplify the membership categories available. The Membership is complex at the moment so we need to simplify it. The Committee will discuss this over the coming months and present the preferred options to the AGM. In general our Club is in a reasonable position compared to most of the Clubs in the area. All Clubs are fighting to retain membership and players. We are not alone in that struggle our membership has been reasonably constant over the last few years but it would be great if the number

could be increased. If you know of someone who may want to join a Tennis Club please recommend the Club.

Last year we investigated the possibility of taking over East Ringwood Tennis Club, after trying to make things work, membership has not increased and with little expectation of a major turn around the Committee made a decision not to proceed with the takeover. The Club did financially support East Ringwood, however that money is being repaid by East Ringwood. I wish East Ringwood well and hope they succeed.

The Club AGM is fast approaching. Please consider standing for the Committee as the Club needs to refresh ideas. I believe it is the sign of a healthy Club to actually have elections rather than just the bare minimum nominate and get elected unopposed.

I would also like to Thank Tim Neate for his design of the new Club Logo. The logo has a new fresh look that will stand the test of time

#### How to get the premium price for your property!

If at all possible, we strongly advise that teams organise an afternoon where they can have a team practise. Especially working on doubles tactics as each player plays two doubles and one singles per week. The exception being Open Rubbers format where players play one of each. However, in Open Rubbers, it consistently shows that the team winning the doubles invariably wins the match. Not always but more often than not.

At the holiday break, we have 12 of 17 teams positioned in the semi final. Another strong season if we can keep up the enthusiasm that has been evident so far this season.

Most gratifying is seeing more kids coming through from HOTSHOTS into junior competition. Our 5 lowest teams are made up of children coming directly from our HOTSHOTS program, with more eager to start in the summer.
