I certainly did not see the Club would lose the significant income from the shutdown of Competition and Tournaments. Through all the challenges the Club faced our dedicated Committee, Coaches and Convenors worked together to keep the Club together and respond quickly to the ever-changing rules and regulations.

I would also like to acknowledge Maroondah City Council and particularly the Sport and Recreation Portfolio led by Kirstie Dench. Maroondah has been particularly supportive and proactive in getting sporting clubs like ours back on the court. In one case we had approval to recommence using the courts within 4 minutes of the paperwork being submitted.

Whilst we have not been able to play Tennis for much of the year, the Club has been busy with a re-build of Court 8. The court was bedded in by watering and rolling by Volunteers who lived within the 5-kilometre limit. I would like to thank, Noel Phillips, Sylvia James, Mark Guscott, John Whitehead and David Lovett. These volunteers, along with myself, watered and rolled the court several times a week ensuring the court would be ready for play. The court is currently ok for light play. If you do play on Court 8 please make sure any marks are bagged and well-watered before leaving the court and be aware for a few months it will play heavy.

This period also saw the electronic lock on the gates and toilet door commissioned. This enhances the security of the Club and provides the Committee the ability to lock out former members. The Committee is investigating future upgrades to the alarm system and the installation of CCTV to improve the security and safety at the Club.

Tennis Tips

After a prolonged break, coming back to tennis (or any sport) can create potential risk for injury. It's important that you stretch before playing and build stamina so that when you come to match play, your conditioned and ready to win!

One of our resident club professionals, Rob has given this key tip. "Be sure to focus on hitting the ball earlier. My biggest observation of recreational players is that they wait for the ball to drop on to their racquet. Focussing on earlier shot preparation means that you're well placed to be more aggressive in striking the ball at the top of the rise. This puts you in a stronger position to control the point!"
