Robin Lowe Arena

Sale Tennis Club has honoured long serving President, Robin Lowe, by naming Showcourts 1 and 2 “**Robin Lowe Arena**” as permanent recognition of his contribution to the Club over many years as well as for his role in the redevelopment of the clubhouse and courts that has stretched out over 3 difficult years.

Club Vice-President Murray Fitzclarence made the presentation to Robin on Life Members Day on December 18. Murray noted that Robin has been involved in all of the Club’s significant developments over the past 2 decades commencing with the building of the Clubs first two showcourts, 1 and 2 and the splendid John Leslie Grandstand in the mid 2000’s. The Club, with Robin’s enthusiastic leadership, then spent nearly a decade seeking funding for its grand plan to build 4 more international size courts, redevelop the clubhouse and the remaining 8 en-tout-cas courts including new fences, LED lighting, battery storage solar power, accessible paths and a spectator friendly layout.

The first big breakthrough happened when John Leslie committed \$500,000 on behalf of the John Leslie Foundation. This encouraged Tennis Australia to then commit \$150,000 and the Club had its first important steps toward its ambitious plans. (Unfortunately John Leslie did not live to see the redevelopment come to fruition but we know he would have been very proud of what has been achieved.)

What then followed was a frustrating series of near misses, with State Government Major Facilities and other grants applied for but not approved. This all changed with the formation of the Latrobe Valley Authority Community Facility Fund which was tasked with offsetting the economic impact of the closure of Hazelwood Power Station. An initial grant application of \$1.0 million was approved and things started moving forward in earnest from then. Wellington Shire committed \$500,000, the Federal Governments Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Fund \$150,000 and then John Leslie Foundation increased their contribution by a further \$100,000. All this added to the Clubs own contribution to make a \$2.85 million dollar investment.

This allowed tenders to be released, contracts to be let and the redevelopment was under way. However as Scottish poet Robert Burns would remind us *"the best-laid plans of mice and men often go awry, and leave us naught but grief and pain, for promised joy!"* and significant problems with court building and then COVID made for some very difficult times. Through all of this, Robin, as President of the Club, was at the forefront trying to achieve best outcomes at every twist and turn. Of course *"no man is an island"* and Robin was well supported by a strong committee and our ever vigilant curator, Bruce Carter, who has dedicated a massive amount of time and effort to the project. As they say *"the rest is history"* and we now have a magnificent facility of which we can all be proud.

We are already hearing rumours that Robin is now refusing to concede defeat on any match he plays on *Robin Lowe Arena* so we will have to wait and see how that plays out.



Coaches Column

What a summer of tennis! We wrapped up the final term for 2021 with a Christmas Holiday Clinic with Saint Nick making a guest appearance and playing some points against 40+ kids. Next step was an Australian Open Holiday Clinic, a 3-day event full of fun group drills and games to assist them to improve their overall game. We completed the jam-packed summer of tennis at Day 1 of the Australian Open where 10 lucky local Sale kids graced the courts at Melbourne Park for a Kids-on-court Experience. Kai Garg was given the privilege to toss the coin for a match on John Cain Arena between past Aus Open Winner Sofia Kenin and Madison Keys on live TV.

To top it all off we couldn't have scripted 2 more deserving AO Champions for our kids to look up to: Ash Barty and Rafa Nadal both symbolize the definition of hard work, dedication and humility.

As we approached the beginning of Term 1, 2022, I spent countless days and nights creating a new schedule with several new programs introduced with the goal to develop a tennis training pathway to cater for all ages and skill levels. Our most exciting new program is catering for the tiny tots. Now you can start introducing kids as young as 4 years old to tennis lessons. The tennis training pathway is as follows:

Launchpad Beginner Hotshots ➡ Hotshots Juniors ➡ Beginner / Intermediate / Advanced Juniors ➡ Junior Talent Squad ➡ High Performance Squad.

I have also introduced a Junior Fitness Program, which is run in the mornings before school focusing on building fundamentally sound, physically strong, mentally tough and emotionally intelligent humans on and off the court. I didn't forget about you big grown-up kids out there with Adult Cardio Coaching and Personal Training / Private Lessons on offer.

To say it has been a busy and chaotic start to the Term would be an understatement. Almost all the programs are running at full tilt, many new faces have joined, and the feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. To cater for the increase in demand, we have started a new Coaching Mentorship Program where 4 new High-Performance kids, who have displayed a great attitude on and off the court, were chosen to become qualified as Assistant Coaches: Alex Boxall, Samuel Bertino, Aaron Donaldson and Rachel Page. They have all hit the ground running and have already made an amazing impact on the program. We are truly excited to have them onboard as a part of the team and pumped to watch them grow personally, whilst assisting the younger kids to become better well-rounded tennis players.

As we approach the end of the term, we are on the lookout for players, young and old, to jump on the Sale TC team bus to take on Bairnsdale's best in the Dahlsens Challenge on April 3rd. 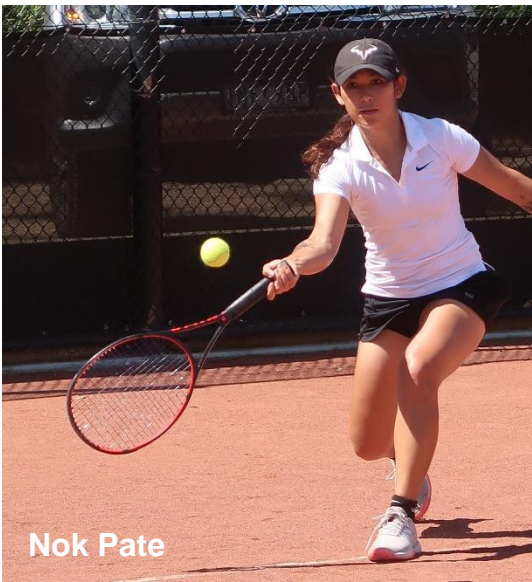

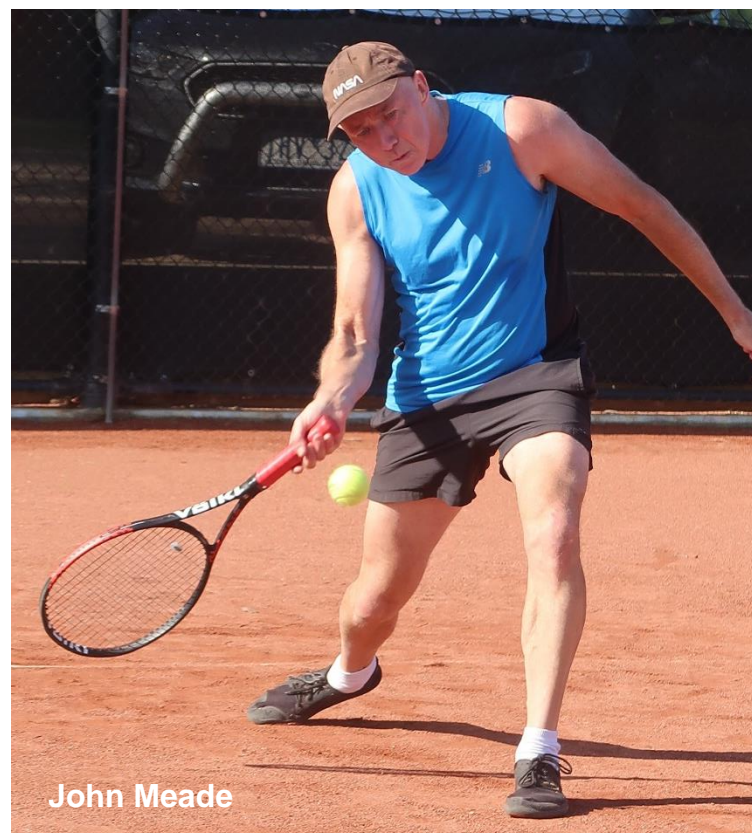

UTR Rating System Adopted by Tennis Australia

From 1 January 2022, Tennis Australia will adopt the Universal Tennis Rating (UTR) rating across all forms of Competitive Play Events to determine entry and seeding / grading. UTR Rating Bands will also be used to define Event draws.



The UTR Rating will be incrementally introduced into League Competitive Play opportunities throughout 2022 as the National Player Rating System is phased out.

What is a UTR Rating and why should you get one?

A UTR Rating is a number that is designed to provide a real and accurate measurement of skill level. A player's UTR rating is a number between 1.00 and 16.50. One match result is all it takes to receive a projected UTR rating. After approximately five matches, the rating becomes fully reliable. As matches are played and entered into the system, a player's UTR Rating will increase or decrease over time to reflect their current skill level.

How is the UTR Rating calculated?

For each match, the algorithm calculates a match rating and a match weight for each player. A player's UTR rating is the weighted average of up to 30 of their most recent match ratings. Only matches within the last 12 months count toward a player's UTR Rating.

Calculating Match Rating

Two factors are considered when calculating the match rating. The first factor is the UTR rating difference between opponents. The second factor is the competitiveness of the match, as determined by the percent of total games won. Given the UTR rating difference, the algorithm expects a certain percentage of total games won. The player who performs better than the algorithm's expectation will see their match rating go up while the other player's match rating will go down. When one player's match rating increases, the other player's match rating decreases by the same amount.

Calculating Match Weight

The following factors are used in the match weight calculation:

Format – As the match format increases in length, more weight is given. A match with a three-set format receives more weight than a match with an eight-game pro set format.

Competitiveness – As the UTR rating difference between players increases, less weight is given. For example, imagine a player with a UTR Rating of 6.00. A match played against an opponent with UTR Rating of 5.00 or 7.00 receives more weight than a match played against an opponent with a UTR of 4.00 or 8.00.

Reliability – As the reliability of the opponent's UTR rating increases, more weight is given. A match played against an opponent who competes often and thus has a reliable UTR rating receives more weight.

Time Degradation – As prior matches get older, less weight is given. Since the algorithm is a representation of current form, it gives more credit to matches played within the last few months.

What's the best way to improve your UTR?

Play Well – Performing well in matches is the easiest way to improve your UTR Rating. If the match is out of hand, don't give up! It does not matter whether you play higher- or lower-rated opponents; you can improve your UTR Rating either way by winning more games than expected.

Play Often – The more matches you play, the quicker your UTR rating will reflect your current form. The algorithm is especially accurate for those who play often against a variety of opponents rated above and below you.

Be Patient – Since your UTR rating is a rolling weighted average, the effect of new results is slightly lagged. Your UTR rating may not fully reflect a recent outcome right away, but it will over time.

Tennis Seniors Victoria – Sale Tennis Club - May 13 – 15

Sale Tennis Club will host a Tennis Victoria Seniors National Ranking Tournament scheduled for 13 to 15 May, 2022. This is the first major tournament at the Sale facility since the completion of our \$2.8 million redevelopment.

Events cater for players 30 and over and include age based singles, doubles and mixed events. All events are “round robin” ensuring players get plenty of tennis.

NRT tournaments contribute to the newly adopted Universal Tennis Rating (UTR) with all players able to increase their worldwide ranking. Local support is essential to ensure a successful 2022 event and its scheduling in future years. Mark your diary and make sure to enter early.

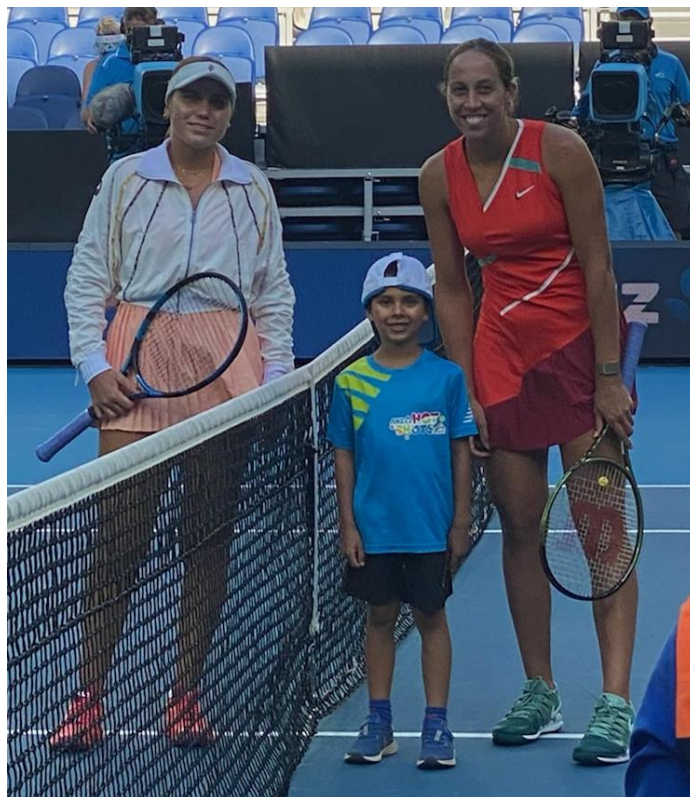

Sale Hot Shots on John Cain Arena at the AO

TA Community Coaching Course

Sale Tennis Club hosted a Community Coaching course on the weekend of February 26 and 27. The Community Coaching course is aimed at those that would like to begin coaching tennis, or who are currently coaching, under the guidance of a qualified tennis coach. The course trains coaches to develop the skills of junior tennis players with a focus on the Tennis Hot Shots program.

There were 6 participants in the course, 5 from Sale Tennis Club and 1 from Bairnsdale Tennis Club. The course was delivered by Tennis Victoria Coaching Leader, Jon Watson. Jon is a very experienced coach leader having worked in the coaching field for over 35 years, predominantly in the UK and Australia. Current roles within Tennis Victoria is as Coach Leader mentoring and supporting coaching in the region and Tennis Australia Coach Development facilitating and presenting courses and workshops. Jon is particularly interested in developing and delivering fun and inclusive programs for preschool aged children and athletes with a disability.

The participants spent the majority of the time during the course on-court actively learning to deliver coaching sessions where players serve, rally and score using modified balls, racquets, nets and courts appropriate to the developmental needs of junior players.

The aim of the course is to prepare coaches to conduct Tennis Hot Shots activities, introduce the role and responsibilities of a tennis coach and introduce basic coaching methods.

The participants will now have an opportunity to return to their clubs and apply their new skills with the Hot Shots children under the watchful eyes of their supervising coach.

Sale Tennis Club is hopeful of hosting a further course later in the year if there is sufficient demand.

In the 10 & Under Boys Judah Levchenko won an entertaining match against Henry Seeber, finally coming out on top 6-4 as well as taking out the 12 & Under Doubles with his brother, Josiah.

Louis Lazzaro had a successful championships taking out the 14 & Under Singles and then paired with Dylan Board to take out the 14 & Under Doubles..

In the Open Women's Singles Jess Board from Sale was looking to return to the Honour Board after being edged out last year by Stephanie Barnett from Bairnsdale. Her opponent in the final was another Bairnsdale player, Jamye Waites who played great tennis to win through to the final. The final was a high quality match with Jess finally overcoming Jamye in straight sets.

In the Open Men's Singles Mitchell Allman was looking to defend the title he has held continuously since 2017. 2022 would prove to be his most difficult defence yet as he took on Daniel Storman from Bairnsdale. Playing before an enthralled crowd the tennis was the best played on Showcourt 1 since the last Pro-circuit event in 2008. Mitchell took the first set 7 - 5 but Daniel hit back taking the second set 6 – 4. The third set was decided by a super tiebreak which Mitchell eventually took out 10 -8, giving him 5 titles in a row.

Tournaments such as the Association Championships are an essential part of the player development pathway for juniors and provides an opportunity for match play and experience for the next level of play such as Open Junior Tournaments.

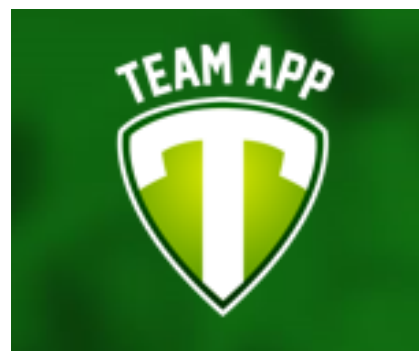
Mia said "That the most important thing that I learned at the Masters event was that persistence is the key to improvement". So wise for her young years and right on point with the core values of the Academy.

Ball Machine Hire



Our ball machine is available for hire for a small fee of \$5. The money collected will pay for its maintenance and eventual replacement. The most suitable times are between 3:00 and 7:00 pm weekdays as the Clubhouse will be open. Outside of these times you will need to arrange access to the Clubhouse through a committee member via our new key safe installed outside the pro-shop.

To avoid disappointment bookings can also be made via the link on TeamApp.

We would also prefer for the ball machine to be used on the **hard courts or Courts 5 – 7**, as these are the most settled. We have been getting some unfortunate baseline damage on our newest courts due to the repetitive nature of ball machine use.

Parking and Traffic Flow

Now that our upgrade is complete and our carpark has been graded it is time to properly understand our parking arrangements. The north side of Courts 8 to 12 is all angle parking. Please don't park along the adjacent wire fence as someone might accidentally back into you. In front of Courts 5 to 7 parking is parallel parking along the wire fence. Please avoid the drain area where the cones are.

Traffic flow is strictly one way - all east to west – no entry from the Seed Community Garden end please. Our carpark is an area that is shared with pedestrians, especially children, so please observe the 15 kph speed limit for this area.

Court Care Reminder

A reminder that en-tout-cas courts require some essential maintenance if we are all to enjoy playing on them at their best and preserve them for future generations.

- ❖ **Water** - It is vital that you water your court before the start of each set. (The only exception is if it has just been raining.) Please water the whole court all the way to the fence and avoid making large puddles. Many people only water the lined court area but you spend more time behind the baseline than on any other part of the court so be sure to water all areas. Take your time and ensure a thorough even cover. Nobody should commence any play on courts that are totally dry and dusty. This will gouge the courts resulting in potentially significant and expensive damage. All courts should have some moisture in them before play – just how much will depend on the prevailing climatic conditions.
- ❖ **Bagging** – Please bag the whole court after each set. Bag all the way to the baseline fence. Don't turn around as you reach the baseline, keep going until your nose touches the fence, then turn around.
- ❖ **Shoes** - All players should wear correct clay court tennis shoes – cross-trainers are unacceptable. Any player seen not wearing proper tennis shoes may be asked to leave the courts.
- ❖ **Nets** - If you arrive at the Club and see courts with the nets lowered, this is a sign that these courts are under repair so no play should occur on these courts. Please respect this and do not play on these courts.

With proper care our courts will last a lifetime. Please ensure you do your part.
