Judy Dalton Cup

The Judy Dalton Cup is a Regional Teams competition providing the opportunity for the best 13 and under girls from rural Victoria to compete against each other while representing their region. Although tennis is an individual sport this event gives players the enjoyment of playing within a supportive team environment.

The event is named after Judy Dalton, the former Australian professional tennis player who won nine major doubles titles and completed the career Grand Slam in women's doubles. Five of her doubles titles were with Margaret Court. She reached the final at Wimbledon in 1968, where she lost to Billie Jean King in two tight sets. Dalton reached a career-high singles ranking of No.7 in 1968, the same year she reached the Wimbledon final. She was also a member of Australia's winning Fed Cup teams in 1965 and 1970. She finished her career with an 18-4 winloss record in the competition.

Her greatest legacy to women's tennis was her part in the Original 9. Dalton was one of nine female players who broke away from the tennis establishment to form their own tour to protest the inequality on prize money and support in comparison to their male counterparts. This paved the way for the formation of the WTA. In retirement, Dalton remained active in promoting women in tennis as President of the Australian Fed Cup Foundation.

Why is any of this important you ask? The answer is that Sale Tennis Club is hosting the Judy Dalton Cup on October 29 and 30. We will have teams from Barwon, Central Gippsland, Central Highlands, Goulburn, Loddon Campaspe, Mornington Peninsula, North East, Northern Mallee, South West, Wimmera and of course our own East Gippsland region.

The Frank Sedgman Cup

The Frank Sedgman Cup is a metropolitan and regional teams event that showcases emerging junior talent and provides players with the opportunity to represent their region in a team environment.

Francis "Frank" Sedgman is an Australian former world No. 1 tennis player. Over the course of a three-decade career, Sedgman won five Grand Slam singles tournaments as an amateur as well as 22 Grand Slam doubles tournaments. He is one of only five tennis players all-time to win multiple career Grand Slams in two disciplines, joining Margaret Court, Roy Emerson, Martina Navratilova and Serena Williams. In 1951, he and Ken McGregor won the Grand Slam in men's doubles. In 1952 a 24-year-old Frank Sedgman swept the singles, doubles and mixed doubles titles at The Championships — a feat that no other player has replicated in the seven decades since.

On an unseasonably warm and sunny day at the end of July, 4 local 11&U kids represented East Gippsland in the Frank Sedgman Cup, at Bairnsdale. The format of play consisted of a mixed doubles and a singles match for each round.

The team, consisting of Paige Hosford (Heyfield), Anna Banson (Bairnsdale), Judah Levchenko (Sale) and Henry Seeber (Sale) joined 11 other teams from across Victoria to participate in this great showcase of young talent.

East Gippsland were really challenged early on, going down 5 sets to 1 against the highly fancied North Suburban Junior Tennis Association. Highlight of the tie was Paige securing a hard fought win, 6-3.

Next up was Waverley, where they were again challenged, finding themselves competing against a strong metropolitan outfit.

Towards the end of day, the team dug deep, narrowly losing to Peninsula, with Henry and Anna combining well to win their doubles 6-4. Judah also prevailed 6-4 in his singles, in a match that included many epic rallies.

Unfortunately the weather turned arctic for the second day, with single digit temperatures and icy blasts. Despite the conditions, the team was better matched to play fellow regional teams Wimmera and Central Gippsland.

The tie against Wimmera was by far the best performance, with the team winning all 6 sets. The highlight being both Anna and Paige winning 6-0 in their respective singles.

The tie against Central Gippsland saw some extremely competitive hitting, with Central Gippsland coming out on top. Overall, East Gippsland ended the tournament in tenth position.

The weekend provided the juniors with an opportunity to compete at a high standard of tennis, whilst also, importantly, beginning friendships for future competitions. Next year's event is scheduled to be played at Wodonga.

Saturday Summer Pennant – Seniors


Sale Tennis Club is now recruiting for the coming Wellington Gippsland Tennis Association summer pennant which commences on Saturday, October 1.

The Dahlsens Challenge

Sale Tennis Club travelled to Bairnsdale on Saturday June 18 to try to defend the Dahlsens Challenge Shield. The Challenge, which is usually played annually, was disrupted in 2021 by COVID and then the proposed April 3 date was postponed with some of the worst weather imaginable.

Nearly 60 players competed in the Challenge, which involves both junior and senior players competing on behalf of their Club and town.

Like the Davis Cup, each town has a Captain, being the respective club professional coaches, Jason Yap from Sale and Gavin McCoy from Bairnsdale, who pick the overall teams and individual match ups.

On a perfect winters day the competition started with a round of singles for the juniors and doubles for the seniors. The juniors relished the chance to showcase their skills and the standard of tennis was a credit to them all. The improvement achieved over the past season has been remarkable and the tennis was captivating for those that assembled to watch.

The Sale seniors found the early doubles matches tough work against their Bairnsdale opponents who were playing some great tennis however held their own as the matches progressed with the result that at the end of Round 1 Sale finished with a convincing lead.

The next round was a doubles rubber and the Sale juniors relished the challenge, showing the benefit of the hard work they have done during the season and teaming well together to open up a decisive lead.

The final round saw Barinsdale take the court with the Dahlsens Challenge trophy firmly on the line but the deficit was too great and Sale ran out convincing winners.

The Challenge ended with the two coaches playing a singles match in front of an enthralled crowd. Gavin McCoy served first and games remained on service until the tiebreak. In the tiebreak Jason Yap took the early points but McCoy was able to claim a vital mini-break and went on to take out the match. The tennis was exceptional and the spectators, especially the children coached by the respective players, were inspired by the stroke play.

Sale Tennis Club President Robin Lowe was on hand to accept the Dahlsens Challenge Shield and to thank their hosts from Bairnsdale, the players, the coaches, the volunteers who helped with organisation and catering and especially Dahlsens for their commitment to and support of local sport.

Events such as the Dahlsens Challenge are important for the development of junior players in regional areas as they provide a rare opportunity for them to be part of a larger team representing their Club and to compete with and test themselves against their peers from other areas.

With the tally now 5 matches to 3 in Sale's favour the Dahlsens Challenge will return in 2023 with Bairnsdale making the trip to Sale to try to win back the Shield.

Jo Rule travelled to Lisbon in Portugal to represent Australia in the 2022 ITF World Masters Teams event from Sunday the 31st of July to Friday the 5th of August.

One of the leading Sale Tennis Club players, Jo has been travelling the Tennis Masters Circuit competing in singles and doubles over the last couple of years. This hard work and success resulted in her being selected to represent Australia at the 2022 ITF World Team Championships. Jo was playing in the Margaret Court Cup for women aged 45+ and was the Number 1 lady for Australia. The format was both singles and doubles.

Next up was Sweden and finally Turkey. While the Aussie team did not have any victories their tennis improved as the event went on and Jo's final singles match was a narrow 6-3 7-6 loss.

LV UMPIRES ASSOCIATION



Moving into finals is always busy for us, but none so busy as this year. Our milestones keep appearing this week, and once again, it's time for a big one!

Our premier milestone for this week will be at Morwell v Sale Seniors, when Robert Tatterson takes his place between the goals for his 1000th game.

It takes the utmost dedication, commitment and passion for the game you love to commit two thirds of your life to umpiring football, and that is just what Robert Tatterson has done. Tatto began his umpiring journey as a 20 year old with the Sale panel in 1981, chalking up over 200 games under the guidance of coach lan Couchman. Bob Thomas advised him to drive down the highway to the Latrobe Valley Umpires who at that stage were officiating the Latrobe Valley Football League. In 1989, Tatto tag-teamed between the Sale and Valley Panels for a season and has continued the drive along the highway up to 3 times a week since. After 34 years (apart from

2003 when work took him to East Gippsland were he umpired for the

season) with the LVUA, Tatto chalks up another amazing milestone in a career full of magical moments.

The early years were highly competitive with a lot of excellent umpires taking to the field and Rob held his own with the best. His mantra of 'never be afraid to blow the whistle' has stood him in good stead throughout his umpiring career earning three Mid Gippsland and one Gippsland Senior Grand Final as a field umpire with the team. Rob's commitment to country football has not stopped just because his knees have, moving on to goal umpiring and the important role of junior mentor for our up-andcoming field umpires. The constant call of 'can I run with Tatto' from our juniors shows the respect he has earnt, not only as an umpire but as a person. His love of the game of football and the people associated with the clubs,

leagues and umpiring teams has been a major driver for his longevity in the sport. He has always loved talking to the country footy people with a Woodstock in one hand and the other outstretched for a hand shake. Jess Board Selected in Victorian Pizzey Cup Team



3 time Sale Tennis Club Open Women's Club Champion Jess Board has been selected in the Victorian Pizzey Cup team. The Pizzey Cup is a prestigious national schools tennis championships open to students from Year 7 through to Year 12 inclusive.

The Jack Pizzey Cup was inaugurated in 1963 with the then Queensland Minister for Education, the Rt. Hon. Jack Pizzey donating the trophy. Jack Pizzey was a secondary school teacher and became Premier of Queensland in January 1968 until his sudden and untimely death in July of that year.

Tennis Victoria and Tennis Australia support School Sport Victoria in the delivery of the National Secondary School Teams event – the Pizzey Cup – with teams competing from every State and Territory. The event provides Victorian secondary school students the opportunity to represent Victoria at the School Sport Australia Championships with the winners awarded the Pizzey Cup and players also receive important Australian Ranking points. The Victorian team is made up of 8 female and 8 male Victorian secondary students aged 18 and under.

Jess is in Year 11 at Gippsland Grammar and is the only player from Gippsland to make the team. Jess is currently 3150 in the ITF junior world rankings and over the past month she has played Junior International Tennis Federation events in Indonesia, Vietnam and has just returned from an event in Fiji.

The 2022 Pizzey Cup will be held in Perth from August 27 to September 3.
