

# Water main connection works in Glen Waverley

**Melbourne Water will soon be undertaking works related to the connection of two major water mains in your local area.**

The works will involve installing two new valves (a device for controlling the flow of water) at the connection, which is located underneath a Melbourne Water pipe track near the junction of High Street Road and Blackburn Road in Glen Waverley.

The upgrade works will make it easier for Melbourne Water operational staff to regulate the flow of water in these water mains when needed. This is important to ensure the community continues to be provided with a reliable and secure water supply.

**There will be no interruptions to your sewerage or water services during the works.**

## Timing of works

**Works are planned to start in early June 2020** and are expected to take approximately 8-10 weeks to complete (subject to weather conditions).

Works will take place between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday. Residents and businesses will be advised in advance if works are necessary outside of these hours.

## What to expect during construction

Whilst we will make every effort to ensure inconveniences are kept to a minimum, there will be some localised impacts including:

- Noise from trucks and other vehicles, reversing beepers, machinery and other equipment.
- Construction vehicle movements in Latham Court for access to the works zone. Detour arrangements, signage and traffic controllers will be in place to assist and ensure motorists and pedestrians are able to safely navigate around our work areas.

We ask that the community take extra care when walking through the Council reserve and around local streets where there will be an increase in construction vehicle movements. We suggest that dogs are kept on a leash at all times for their safety.

- Temporary closure to pedestrian access through a small section of the local reserve around our works zone.
- Removal of two non-native trees (Desert Ash) and one native tree (Paperbark), and some trimming to surrounding vegetation to enable access for vehicles and machinery.

After the works have been completed, we will replace the trees that were removed by re-planting native trees in the local area. We'll also rehabilitate disturbed areas in accordance with reinstatement plans approved by Monash City Council.

Melbourne Water and our project delivery partners, Aqua Metro Services (AMS), thank you in advance for your patience and understanding while we carry out these essential works.
