When you visit the centre whether playing or not you are required to sign into the Service NSW QR Code which is on the clubroom door and also on each court gate. It is your responsibility to sign in.




Grants

Our grounds

Awesome work was accomplished by a very enthusiastic bunch of workers on Sunday 11 April at our Working Bee. Ursula and Sam attacked the overgrown shrubs along the side of court 1 and the fence line behind the courts pruning everything in their way. Now the plants are well back from the fence. Margo, the dynamo, cleaned all the clubhouse windows inside and out and they now sparkle. Jen's timing was superb arriving just as Margo finished the last window. Jen made up for it by fixing the holes at the back of the courts to stop balls going under. Colin Chase and Sam helped me shovel off dirt in the car park and dig a channel so the water runs away from the car park. This dirt will be used to top dress the lawn. Noel, lan and myself then attacked the plants in the garden in front of court 1 removing all plants and weeds. Small problem eventuated when I put a small hole in the water pipe which we found was only a few centimetres under ground. Ever ready Phil turned off the water supply and came back later to repair the hole. In the meantime the rugby club had no water for about an hour. Phil replaced the rotting seat rail and rust proofed the brackets of the seat outside court 4. Great job Phil. Colin got his trusty hedger going and pruned plants along the path to the clubhouse. The entry path now looks neat and tidy. Margot and Jen sprung up the ladder and cleaned the roof over the toilets. This has quite a few holes so needs attention by the council. Bron brought her brother David along and he grabbed (was put in his hand) a mattock and helped Noel in the garden at court 1. Apparently David wants to join our club - this was a good start to his application. Bron, Margot, Jen and Ursula dragged all the pruned plants to the car park. Everything looked under control so I checked the roof for leaks. The gutters were making very good compost and the roof had about 10 balls on it and heaps of debris. Time ran out before the cleaning job was completed. This will be a priority next working bee. A fantastic effort by all attendees and I thank you very much for all your hard work sprucing up our wonderful club grounds.. A huge thanks to Sam, Ursula, Margot, Jenny, Noel, Bronwyn, David, Phil and Colin Chase. The coffee afterwards at Peneenies was delicious.
