COVID 19 Update

The following is an extract of the current rules from the coronavirus website as provided by Knox City Council and must be complied with at all times.

Victoria returns to COVIDSafe Settings from 11:59pm Friday 26 February 2021

- You must always carry a face mask with you when you leave home unless you have a lawful reason not to. It is also recommended that you wear a face mask when exercising when you cannot keep 1.5 metres distance from others, except where that exercise or physical activity leaves you short of breath or puffing.
- The number of people allowed in an indoor physical recreation or community sport facility is defined by the size of the space. Indoor spaces need to follow the four square metre rule when staffed. Wantirna Tennis Club will continue to display notices limiting the persons in the club house at any one time to 26. In addition to this, if the 1.5m distance cannot be kept, mask wearing is required.
- Venues are required to record attendance. Electronic record keeping is recommended. The Victorian Government has a free QR code system you can use.
 Manual sign in and QR code facilities are available at both front & back doors – this requirement applies to the grounds as well as the club house
- Communal change rooms, showers and toilets are open. There are signs on the toilet doors explaining there is 3 person limit in these areas at any time.
- While exercising you should keep at least 1.5 metres distance between yourself and others. Venues are required to record attendance and electronic record keeping is recommended.

Additional notes:

- No cooking or meal preparation in the club house kitchen should be undertaken
- Knox Council has requested that we limit the use of the club house where/when feasible
- Team captains/duty teams etc are still responsible for appropriate cleaning/vacuuming/rubbish bin emptying/toilet roll replenishment after each session
- Current restrictions imposed by various tennis associations including the no supper/afternoon tea rules continue to apply until further notice.

Coaching update from Mike and Troy

Mike's AO 2021 diary

The 2021 Australian Open was unlike any other that I'd experienced in my 17 years. My AO started back on January 29 on a day where the Melbourne weather gods decided to dump 50mm of rain on about a 100 of us trying to get our accreditation outside of Melbourne Park. An hour later and after going through a dozen check points I finally managed to get onsite, completely soaked to the skin. This was going to be the story of the tournament.

The lead week was chaos! Normally the qualifying event takes place during his week as well as the main draw players arriving into Melbourne to practice. Not this year, Tennis Australia decided to host 6, yes 6 tour level events all at once at the one venue. Fair to say, this has never been attempted before and probably never will again! Rules akimbo, nervous players, worried officials and tension in the air somehow, somehow we got through one of the craziest weeks in tennis. I'm thinking anyone who has run a junior or country grass tournament with multiple events is probably scoffing...

AO 2021 started on the 8th and it actually felt pretty normal, albeit without the hordes of fans that normally stream down Olympic Boulevard and through Garden Square. It felt like the tournament was building with Nick Kyrgios seeming to be the spark and by day 4 the crowds were growing and there was a real buzz about the place. Then, at 11:30pm on the first Friday the couple of thousand fans that were in Rod Laver Arena for the Djokovic/Fritz match were ushered out of the stands. For the next five days Melbourne Park was a ghost town around the grounds and a hive of activity underneath. Plenty of action on the court, but tumbleweeds out on Grand Slam Oval and in Garden Square. Ironically, over the 5 days I don't remember seeing a cloud in the sky.

Thankfully, crowds returned in time for the finals where Tsitsipas upset Nadal from two sets to love down and Naomi Osaka defeated Serena Williams in a bold showing. To me these two matches signalled the dawn of a new era in tennis, new champions are going to emerge and those Grand Slam records that once looked like being smashed may hold yet.

As always, this event is an absolute privilege to be a part of, we are soooo lucky to have it in our backyard and we should never forget that. Bring on AO2022.
